

The raised table would be approximately 4 metres in length, approximately 75 millimetres in height, with gradients of 1:15 to 1:20 on the ramps and would extend across the full width of the carriageway.

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Haringey on 1st November 2018 made the above mentioned Order under sections 6, 45, 46 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.

2. The general effect of the Order will be to remove a resident's permit holders parking space outside No. 69 Middle Lane, and replace it with single yellow line waiting restrictions operating at zone hours. This is to facilitate the installation of a vehicle crossover.

3. Highways England Company Limited hereby gives notice that it intends to revoke an existing Order and make a new Order under sections 1(1), 2(1) and (2) and 4(1) and (2) of, and Paragraph 27(1) of Schedule 9 to, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 on the A5 Trunk Road at Towcester, in the County of Northamptonshire.

The effect of the Order would be to prohibit, with exemptions, any vehicle from waiting at any time on any day on –

1). a length of the eastern side of the A5 between points 79 metres north and 89 metres north of the centreline of its junction with Northampton Road; and

2). lengths of the western side of the A5 –

(a) between points 48 metres north and 107 metres north of the centreline of its junction with Brackley Road;

(b) between points 137 metres north and 198 metres north of the centreline of its junction with Brackley Road;

(c) between points 13 metres south and 23 metres south of the centreline of its junction with Richmond Road; and

(d) between points 47 metres north and 64 metres south of the centreline of its junction with Vernon Road.

The Order will allow parking in designated parking places on the footway between points 56 metres north and 95 metres north of the centreline of its junction with Brackley Road.

Highways England Company Limited (Company no. 9346363) hereby gives notice that it intends to make an Order under sections 1(1), 2(1) and (2) and 4(1) and (2) of, and paragraph 27(1) of schedule 9 to, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 on the A5 Trunk Road at Towcester in the County of Northamptonshire.

The effect of the Order would be to vary The A5 Trunk Road (Watling Street, Towcester, Northamptonshire) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 2000 by amending –

(1) article 2 by –

(a) inserting the definition, “disabled person’s badge” has the meaning given in regulation 3(1) of the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000**(b)**;

(b) deleting the word “orange” and substituting the word “blue” from the definition of parking disc;

(c) deleting the definition for relevant position and substituting ““relevant position” has the meaning given in regulation 4 of the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000”; and

(d) inserting the definition “disabled person’s parking place” means the parking bays on a side of the trunk road specified in Part III of the Schedule, intended for the waiting of vehicles displaying, in the relevant position, a disabled person’s badge, which are comprised within and indicated by a road marking complying with diagram 1028.4(v) in Schedule 7 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016**(c)**;

(2) the footnotes on page 1 by –

(a) deleting footnote (b) and substituting “**(b)** S.I. 2000/683; and

(b) inserting the footnote “**(c)** S.I. 2016/362”; and

(3) Part 3 of the Schedule by deleting the words “parking bays” and substituting the words “disabled person’s parking places”
