**T**HE King has promoted the Duke de Populi to the Rank of Brigadier General. The Marquess de Monteleon being arrived here from Holland, has been visited by the chief of the Nobility. On the 7th Instant arrived at Cadix a Frigate called the St. Joseph, which failed from thence the 9th of July last for Vera Cruz, with the Flota commanded by Commodore Don Antonio Serrano consisting of 18 Ships: The Commander of this Frigate has brought an Account, that the said Commodore with 16 of those Ships arrived at Vera Cruz the 20th of September last, and the other two the 15th and 25th of the following Month; without having suffered any Damage in their Voyage. The said Frigate has brought a Number of Planks of Cedar for the King, and the rest of her Lading is Tobacco on the Account of the Royal Treasury. Yesterday being Sunday, the Supreme Council of the Inquisition held an Auto de Fé here, when one Person convicted of Herefy was delivered over to the Secular Arm, and burnt alive.

Hague, March 7, N. S. The Elector of Cologne has notified to the States his being made Bishop of Hildesheim, by a Letter which was presented Yesterday to their High Mightinesses by M. Ganfinot Resident of the Elector of Bavaria, and now also of the said Elector of Cologne, the Credentials for which last Character he delivered with the said Letter of Notification. The States of Utrecht, Over-Yssel, and Gelderland being about to hold their several Assemblies in their respective Provinces, some of their Deputies to the States General are set out from hence to assist at those Assemblies, which are to take into Consideration the Proposal for an Augmentation of Troops, in order to send to the States General their Resolution thereupon. On the 5th Instant the Spanish Secretary delivered a Letter from the new King of Spain, notifying to the States General his Accession to the Crown.
