N the 23d Instant his Portuguese Majesty, accompanied by the Lords in waiting, went to Maafra to fee what Progress had been made in the Cathedral which is building there. M. Merveilleux, a Swise by Birth, is going to make a Tour through this Kingdom, by Order of his said Majesty, to give a Description of the Plants and other Curiosities that may any wise relate to the Natural History of it. By a Letter from Figueira the Merchants here are informed, that several dead Bodies, with Parrots and Monkeys, had been thrown upon that Coast, which they suppose to have been cast away with the Advice-Boat, that is generally dispatched from the Bahia some time before the Fleet, and is now missing: But their Apprehensions for the Fleet itself are partly over, they having received an Account that it was not to fail till the latter end of November, and therefore cannot arrive fo early as was expec-An Order has been lately published, that the Merchant-Ships bound for Brazil may henceforward go fingle, and when they shall fce most convenient, without being obliged to wait the Departure of the Men of War; but that coming from thence they shall ob-ferve the usual Method of Sailing in a Fleet under the Convoy alligned them.

Stockholm, Feb. 19, O. S. Baron Tohrnflycht, one of the Provincial Governours of Upland, has with the Consent of the King and Senate agreed with Count Leyonstedt, who was President of the Auditors Chamber, but has not for two Years been able to officiate by reason of his Age and Instrmities, that he shall resign to him his Post for 3000 Rixdollars, which is two Years Salary; and accordingly he has taken Possession of the said Presidentship. 'There has fallen within these eight Days more Snow than has been seen in many Years, but 'tis apprehended it will rather do Hurt than Good to the Country. General Arnold, the King of Denmark's

Minister at this Court, is recalled, and will leave this Place in a few Days.

Hague, March 14, N. S. Lieutenant General Vander Beek being dead in Flanders, his Government of Sluys is given to Brigadier Welderen Governour of Menin; the Count de la Leck Lieutenant Governour of Ypres, is made Governour of Menin; and is succeeded at Ypres by Collonel Wassenzer. The States General have also promoted Major General Van Els to the Rank of Lieutenant General, in the Room of M. Vander Beek. The Directors of the East-India Company are bere at present, making new Representations to the States in relation to the Offend Company: The Directors of the West India Company are likewise come hither, on Occasion of the Fort of Arquin on the Coast of Africa, which the French having taken Possession of have offered to restore it to the Dutch West India Company, provided they can make out a rightful Claim to it. The Affembly of the States of Holland will fit To-Morrow, in order to which several of the Deputies are already arrived here.

The Right Honourable the Lords of the Treasury, having appointed Money for paying of Half-Pay to the Sea-Officers from the 31st of December 1722, to the 25th of December last, according to His Majesty's Establishment on that Behalf; These are to give Notice, That the said Payments will begin to be made at the Treasurer of the Navy's Office in Broad-street, on Monday the 16th Inastant for the Captains, Tuesday the 17th for the Lieutenants, and Wednesday the 18th for the Masters; that all Persons concerned may then and there attend to receive what may become payable to them, and not only bring with them the Assidavits required, touching their not having enjoyed the Benesit of any publick Employment whatsoever, either at Sea or on Shore, during the Time they are to be paid the said Half-Pay, but also produce Certificates (if they have not done it already) that they have subscribed the Test, and taken the Oaths required by the late Ast of Parliament; and in case any of the said Officers shall not be able to attend themselves to receive their Money, but employ Astornies for that Purpose, that the said Astornies may produce the like Certificates and Assidavits from the Persons they are employed by.
