Common or Down, or should unlawfully and willfully hunt, wound, kill, deunlawfully and willfully hunt, wound, kill, deftroy, or steal any Red or Fallow Deer, or unlawfully rob any Warren or Place where Conies or Hares were usually kept, or should unlawfully steal or take away any Fish out of any River or Pond; or if any Person or Persons from and after the said ift Day of June, should unlawfully and wilfully hunt, wound, kill, destroy, or steal any set His Maiesty's Forrests, or Chases, which were of His Majesty's Forrests, or Chases, which were or should be inclosed with Pales, Rails, or other Fences, or in any Park, Paddock, or Grounds in-closed, where Deer had been or should be usually kept, or should unlawfully and maliciously break down the Head or Mound of any Fish Pond, whereby the Fish should be lost or destroyed; or should unlawfully and maliciously kill, maim, or wound any Cattle, or cut down or otherwise destroy any Trees planted in any Avenue, or growing in any Garden, Orchard, or Plantation for Ornament, Shelter, or Profit, or should set Fire to any House, Barn, or Outhouses, or to any Hovell, Cock, Mow, or Stack of Corn, Straw, Hay, or Wood, or should wilfully and maliciously shoot at any Person in any Dwelling-House or other Place, or should knowingly fend any Letter without any Name subscribed thereto, or signed without any Name subscribed thereto, or insurantee with a fictitious Name, demanding Money, Venifon, or other valuable Thing, or should forcibly rescue any Person, being lawfully in Custody of Contract or other Person for any of the Ofany Officer or other Person for any of the Offences beforementioned; or if any Person or Perfons should, by Gift or Promise of Money or other Reward, procure any of His Majesty's Subjects to joyn him or them in any such unlawful Act, every Person so offending, being thereof lawfully convicted, should be adjudged Guilty of Felony, and should suffer Death as in of Felony, and should suffer Death as in Cases of Felony, without Benesit of Clergy-And whereas it is by the said Act further Enacted, That for the more easy and speedy bringing the Offenders against the said Act to Justice, if any Person or Persons should be charged with being Guilty of any of the Offences aforesaid, before any two or more of HisMajesty's Justices of the Peace of the County where such Offence or Offences were or should be committed, by Information of one or more Credible Person or Persons upon Oath by him or them to be sub-scribed, such Justices before whom such Informations should be made as aforesaid, should forthwith certify under their Hands and Seals, and return such Information to one of the princi-[Price Three Half Pence.]
