Garrison most of this Summer in the Port-Townes of this Kingdome, to their former Quarters. This week arrived here from Genoua, Dom Rafael de Villesa in order to his taking polfestion of the place of President of the Royal-Chamber here, which the Queen Regent hath been lately pleased to bestow upon him.

Don Pedro d'Arragon is preparing for his returne from this Government, upon whole departure, we may expect the Marquis d'Aftorgas, our new Vice-Roy to arrive here from Rame: The Banditi continue to occasion much diforder in these Countries, to the great disturbance of Travellers, and the interruption of our Commerce; for the redressing of which, fome Forces are ordered out, to endeavor to intercept them.

Rome, Octob. 24. On Thursday last the Count de Prado, Ambasilador from the Court of Portugal, had bis last Audience of his Holineis, by whom he was received with much kindnels and esteem; the faid Ambasilador having now fatisfied all his Creditors, to their general content, may in few days begin his journey overland for Portugal.
