### Lisbon, March 19, N. S.

Etters from Seville of the 22d paft tell us, that City, particularly the Metropolitan Church, had fuffered very much ty a violent Storm the 18th in the Morning. On the 16th Inftant arrived here the Fleet from Pernam-buco, confifting of 13 Merchant Ships, under the Convoy of a Man of War. The Gold brought by them is computed at two Millions of Crufades; and that which came by the Bahia Fleet, which arrived here the 1ft Inftant, at Five Millions. Millions.

Madrid, March 22, N. S. The Marquefs de Clermont, who was fent hither by the Duke of Orleans to congratulate on his Part the new King and Queen of Spain upon their Accession to the Throne, has had Audience of their Majesties; the King and Queen there; and defigns to fet out in 10 or 12 Days on his Return to Paris. The Pope's Bull for abolifhing feveral irregular Cuftoms introduced among the Clergy of Spain, and for obliging them to observe more friftly and for obliging them to observe more firstly the Rules of the Council of Trent, has been approved by the King of Spain, who has made a Decree, ordering the faid Bull to be notified to all Ecclefiaticks in his Dominions, with a Provilo that nothing therein shall be understood to derogate from his Royal Authority and Patri-mony. This Bull was brought from Rome eight Months ago, and by Cardinal Belluga Bishop of Murcia laid before the late King, who referred it to the Confideration of the Council of Castile, where it met with great Opposition by the Influence of the Clergy, who are unwilling to be bound to fo ftrict a Duty as the Bull requires of them. On the 15th Inftant his Excellency Mr. Stanhope had Audience of the King and Queen at the Buen-Retiro, to congratulate their Maje-fites on the Part of the King of Great Britain, upon their Acceffion to the Crown. The fame Day the Envoy of Portugal had Audience like-wife, and congratulated their Majefties in the Name of the King his Master, on the same Occa-fion. The King and Queen with the Infantes have been some Days at the Buen-Retiro; their Majesties will return hither a little before Easter, to affift at the feveral Proceffions which are ufualto allift at the leveral frocenions which are utual-ly made in the Holy Week, and after the Eafter Holidays they defign to go to Aranjuez. The Marshal de Tellé is confined to his Bed by a fe-vere Fit of the Gout. The Marquess de Castelar Secretary at War, has been dangerously ill, but is now on the mending hand. This Morning arri-ved a Courier from Rome, dispatched by Cardinal Accuration Sig. Orendayn Secretary of State. Acquaviva to Sig. Orendayn Secretary of State, with Letters for the King of Spain, for the Pope's Nuncio, and for the Envoy of Portugal, giving an Account of the Pope's Death on the 7th In-ftant; whereupon the Portuguefe Envoy imme-diately difpatched an Express to Lisbon.
