THE Marshal de Tessé went on the 31st of last Month to St. Ildesonso. King Lewis set out for St. Ildesonso the 1st Instant with a small Retinue, to pay a Visit to the King his Father and the Queen, and he is expected to return To-Morrow in the Evening: The Queen, King Lewis's Consort, will go next Week to visit their Majesties at St. Ildesonso. The Duke de Veraguas arrived here Yesterday in the Evening from Paris, where he had resided for some Time past. The Marquês de Monteleone will return to St. Ildesonso in a few Days. The Duke of Liria being lately made a Major-General, the Command he had of a Regiment of Foot is given to M. Burgh, Lieutenant Colonel of that Regiment. The Marquês de Feria, who is Alcayde of the Mint, is made Mayor-Domo de la Semana, or Gentleman Usher to his Catholick Majesty. By an Expreß from Cadiz we have an Account of the Arrival there of the Packet-Boat call'd St. Francis Xavier, commanded by Don Miguel Vicuna. This Vessel sailed from Cadiz the Beginning of July last Year for Cartagena, from whence she came the 16th of January, put in at the Havana the 28th of that Month, and leaving that Place the 10th of February, arrived at Cadiz the 17th of last Month.

Hague, April 18, N. S. Yesterday came Advice from Vienna, that on the 5th Instant, at Eight in the Evening, the Empreß was brought to Bed of an Archdutchess. M. Goes, Minister of the States General at the Court of Denmark, died suddenly of an Apoplexy at Copenhagen the 8th Instant. A Placart is published, continuing for Six Years longer the Prohibition to export from this Country Materials used in the Manufacture of Paper. The States of the Province of Holland have not come to any Resolotion yet on the Project for augmenting the Troops of this State.
