THE Marshal de Tesse went on the 31st of last Month to St. Hdefonso. The Duke de Veraguas arrived here Kesterday in the Evening from Paris, where he had resided for some Time past. The Marquels de Monteleone will return to St. Ildefonso in a few Days. 'The Duke of Livia being lately made a Major-General, the Command he had of a Regiment of Foot is given to M. Burgh, Lieutenant Collonel of that Regiment. The Marquels de Feria, who is Alcayde of the Mint, is made Mayor-Domo de la Semana, or Gentleman Ufher to his Catholick Majesty. By an Express from Cadiz we have an Account of the Arrival there of the Packet Boat called St. Francis Xavier. commanded by Don Miguel Vicuna.
