THE Marshal de Tesse went on the 31st of last Month to St. Hdefonfo. King Lewis let out for St. Ildefanla the 1st Instant with a small Retinue, to pay a Visit to the King his Father and the Queen, and he is expected to return To Morrow in the Even-ing : The Queen, King Lewis's Confort, will go next Week to visit their Majeftice at St. Ildefonio. The Duke de Veraguas arrived here Kesterday in the Evening from Paris, where he had refided for some Time past. The Marquels de Monteleone will return to St.Ildefonfo in a few Days. 'The Duke of Liria being lately made a Major-General, the Command he had of a Regiment of Foot is given to M. Burgh, Lieutenant Collanel of that Regiment. The Marquels de Feria, who is Alcayde of the Mint, is made Mayor-Domo de la Semana, or Gentleman Ufher to his Catholick Majefty. By an Express from Cadiz we have an Account of the Arrival there of the Packet Boat called St. Francis Xavier. commanded by Don Miguel Vicuna.
