ROAD RESTRICTIONS

LONDON BOROUGH OF BEXLEY THE BEXLEY (CRAYFORD STATION) (PARKING PLACES) (AMENDMENT NO. XX) TRAFFIC ORDER 2019

1. **NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Council of the London Borough of Bexley propose to make the above mentioned Traffic Order under sections 6, 45, 46, 49 and 124 of and Part IV of schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by Section 8 of and Part 1 of Schedule 5 to the Local Government Act 1985 and all other enabling powers.

2. The general effect of the above mentioned Amendment Order would be to amend the Bexley (Crayford Station) (Parking Places) Traffic Order 2018, to:

(a) reduce the length of the resident permit parking bay to the front of Nos. 104 and 106 Heath Road and the removed part will be replaced by the controlled parking zone restriction of no waiting, Monday to Friday 9am to 11am, denoted by a single yellow line

(b) change the designation of the free parking bay opposite Nos 120 to 124 Heath Road to make it a resident permit parking bay that operates between 9am and 11am Monday to Friday

(c) other minor changes to the wording of items in the schedules are being proposed without making any physical changes on site.

Highways England Company Limited(a) gives notice that they propose to make an Order under powers conferred by Sections 82(2), 83(1), 84(1)(a) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 on the M23 Motorway Junction 11 roundabout in the District of Crawley in the County of West Sussex.
