Turin, May 17, N. S.

THE intended Progress of this Court into Savoy, about the Beginning of Autumn, is now made publick, and Orders have been given to the Count de Nom Master of the Horse, to provide Coaches for that Journey. The King designs to drink the Waters at Amphion near Geneva. Sunday last the 14th Instant was his Sardinian Majesty's Birth-Day; but to avoid Compliments on that Occasion, he retired as usual to the Cæthufian Convent at Colegno near this City. The same Day the Regiment of Suza arrived here, and took Possession of the Citadel, which the Regiment of Savoy left, in order to march into Quarters at Alexandria. The Guards are to march on the 26th Instant towards Annecy in Savoy, and the Regiment of Montferrat is on its Way hither from Nizza to relieve them. Last Night the Marquis de St. George, Great Steward of the Household, died here in the 90th Year of his Age.

Hague, May 23, N. S. On the 21st Instant the Deputies of the States of the Province of Zealand arrived here, and To-Day began their Conferences with those of the Province of Holland, for nominating a President of the Great Council. Prince William of Hesse-Cassel set out from hence Yesterday for Macstricht. M. Buys is preparing to set out for the Court of Denmark a Fortnight hence.

Hague, May 26, N. S. After several Conferences between the Deputies of the Province of Holland and those of Zealand, the latter were this Morning conducted with great Ceremony to the Assembly of the States of Holland, where by the Majority of Voices, M. Binckerhoock was nominated President of the Great Council, being the Person the Deputies of Zealand desired to have chosen. The States of Holland have now under Consideration the continuing the Squadron in the Mediterranean; the Time for which it was first ordered thither being near expired.
