M3 JUNCTION 9 IMPROVEMENTS
NOTICE PUBLICISING A PROPOSED APPLICATION FOR A
DEVELOPMENT CONSENT ORDER**

HIGHWAYS ENGLAND COMPANY LIMITED of Bridge House, 1 Walnut Tree Close, Guildford, GU1 4LZ (“the Applicant”) proposes to make an application (“the Application”) under Section 37 of the Planning Act 2008 to the Secretary of State for Transport for a Development Consent Order.

The Application is for the proposed M3 junction 9 Improvement Scheme in Winchester, Hampshire.

The proposed improvements involve providing free-flowing road links between the M3 and the A34 both northbound and southbound with no need to enter the junction 9 roundabout to travel between the A34 and M3. The A34 southbound link will pass under the M3 with a 50mph speed limit. These changes will reduce congestion on the newly designed dumbbell road layout, helping to make journey times more reliable, improve road safety and reduce air pollution.

Existing routes for walkers, cyclists and horse riders within the scheme boundary will be maintained or upgraded as appropriate. The current path through junction 9, which is part of the National Cycle Route Network (route 23 or NCR 23), will be upgraded to provide a safe continuous link through to Easton Lane, which gives access to Winnall and Winchester.

Development of the proposed improvements would involve utility diversions and a temporary construction compound alongside the A34.

The scheme is an Environmental Impact Assessment development (“EIA development”), as defined by The Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2017 (as amended). An Environmental Statement will be submitted as part of the Application. A Preliminary Environmental Information Report (“PEIR”) forms part of the consultation material.

Consultation on the proposals will take place from 2 July to 27 August 2019. Copies of the consultation brochure and response forms will be available free of charge from 2 July to 27 August 2019 at the following locations and times:

Responses will form the basis of a Consultation Report that will be one of the factors taken into consideration by the Secretary of State for Transport when deciding whether the Application can be accepted for examination. Therefore, in providing any comment, it should be borne in mind that the substance of it may be communicated to others as part of the Consultation Report.
