**T**HIS being His Majesty's Birth-Day, there was a very numerous and splend'd Appearance at Court of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction; and at Night there were Illuminations, Bonfires, and other publick Demonstrations of Joy throughout London and Westminster.

*Madrid, May 22, N. S.* On the 16th Instant arrived here an Express from Cadiz, with the News, that an Advice-Boat from the West-Indies was come in there, with Letters giving an Account that the Gallico is commanded by Admiral Grillo, which sailed from Cadiz in November last, arrived at the Port of Cartagena on the 17th of February last.

*Turin, May 24.* Madame Royale's Obsequies were performed Yesterday with great Solemnity in St. John's, the Cathedral of this City, which had a Mausoleum erected in it, and was illuminated with 3400 white Wax Torches, as it was the Evening before at Vespers. Father Chaberges, a Jesuit, preached the Sermon on this Occasion. A Throne and Canopy were placed in the Church, but none of the Royal Family assisted at the Ceremony; however, the Knights of the Order of the Annonciada, and all the Officers of the Court, with the Nobility of both Sexes, attended in the same Manner and in the same Habits as if the Court had been present.

*Hague, June 2, N. S.* The Deputies of Zealand continue here, and were treated Yesterday, together with those of Holland, by M. Binckershoeck the new President of the Great Council, after he had taken the Oaths for that Employment. The States of Holland continue sitting, in hopes those of Zealand will send some Satisfactory Answer to their last Instances, before the Extraordinary Deputies of that Province leave this Place; particularly for taking a final Resolution on the Project of leaving for four Months longer the Squadron in the Mediterranean.
