**A**N humble Address to His Majesty from his Grace the Duke of Portland, Captain-General and Governour in Chief of the Island of Jamaica, and the Honourable the Council of the said Island, dated the 3d of July 1723, having been transmitted from thence, has been presented to His Majesty by his Grace the Duke of Newcastle, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

Which Address His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously.

Madrid, June 5, N. S. On the 28th past Mr. Stanhope, the British Ambassadour, had an Audience of the Catholick King at Aranjuez, when he presented two Letters from His Britannick Majesty; one being in Answer to a Letter King Lewis wrote to notify to His Majesty his Accession to the Crown, and the other being new Credentials for his Excellency Mr. Stanhope, who returned hither from Aranjuez the 29th. Some Days ago his Catholick Majesty ordered the Duke of Ferdinand, a Grandee of Spain of the first Rank, to leave Madrid in 24 Hours and to repair to Pampelona, for threatening the Superintendent-General of the Revenues, who refused the Duke some Satisfaction for an Affront offered to him by the Officers of the Customs who stopped his Coach as it was entering the Gates of Madrid at Night, and searched it for Contraband Goods but found none; the said Duke set out accordingly for Pampelona, all Intercessions with the King by several Grandees of Spain of the first Rank for revoking the said Order, having been in vain. Don Geronimo Solis, a Son of the Dutchess of Monteleano, Camarera Mayor or first Lady of the Bed Chamber to King Lewis's Queen, is appointed Governour of Malaga.

Turin, June 10. N. S. The Marquess d'Entrèves is preparing with great Diligence to set out for Rothembourg, the Residence of the Prince of Hesse-Rhinfeltz; and several young Gentlemen are providing Equipages with an Intent to accompany him in this Journey. It is said the King and Prince will begin theirs into Savoy on the 26th Instant, though the Princess of Rhinfeltz is not expected till about the Middle of September. We have lately had great and frequent Showers of Hail and Rain, with Thunder and Lightning, to the great Damage of the Corn and Vines. The Roads being infested with Robbers, the Guards are on the Watch to take them: They seized the Night before last about 12 Vagabonds on Suspicion.
