HE last Advices from Cadiz bring an Account, that there lately happened a Difference between fome Soldiers of a Regiment of Marines and others of an Irifh Regiment of Foot quartered there, in which almost all the Men of each Regiment took part, and went out into the Field to put an End to the Difpute by Arms; after an Action which lasted half an Hour, there were found killed upon the Spot about 60 Men; fince which strict Orders Spot about oo wien; ince which itrict Orders have been given for making a fevere Example of the chief Mutineers. Don Francisco de Piscina Commissary General of the Crusade, being in a very advanced Age, has lately obtained Leave of his Majesty to quit his Employment worth 16000 Crowns a Year; and having the Power of Substi-cuting any Barton in his Strend has her thereas tuting any Perfon in his Stead, he has thereupon nominated the Inquifitor General, allowing him Part of his Salary. But the Abbot Grimaldo, Brother of the Marquels of that Name, having the Reversion of the faid Employment, (which the Revenion of the laid Employment, (which depends upon the Approbation of the lope) op-poles the laid Nomination, and defires to have this Affair decided at Rome. The Marshal de Teffé arrived here last Night from Aranjuez; as did also the Marquels de Monteleon. Preparations are making at the Buen-Retiro for the Re-ception of their Catholick Majefties and the whole Court, who are expected here from Aranjuez To-Morrow in the Evening.

Kenfington, June 19. This Day the Count de Broglio, Ambassa dour in Ordinary from his most Christian Majefty, had his first private Audience of the King, to which he was introduced by his Grace the Duke of Newcastle, one of His Majesty's Prin-cipal Secretaries of State, and conducted by Sir Clement Cottrell, Master of the Ceremonies.
