E have Advice from Aix la Chapelle, that the King and Queen of Denmark defign to fet out from thence To-Morrow, to return to Copenhagen by the same Way they came, without making a Tour into Holland as was expected. M. Boys is ordered by the States General to prepare to set out within a Fortnight for Copenhagen. The States of the Province of Holland are to meet the 5th of next Month, at which Time Deputies from the several Admiralties are ordered to attend: Those from Zealand are already arrived. The States General have determined, that their Squadron in the Medi-terranean shall continue there till the 1st of December next; and this Resolution has been fent to Cadiz for Admiral Godin, and to their Minister M. Vander Meer at Madrid. eldest Son of Major General Wassenaer, Captain of a Troop of Dragoons, who was to have married the eldest Daughter of the late Monf. Duyvenvoorde, his Cousin, died the 22d Inftant of the Small Pox at Breda.

On the 9th Instant the Marquels de Cortance, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Sardinia, had Audience of his Majesty, and delivered a Letter from the King his Master notifying to his Majesty the Conclusion of a Treaty of Marriage between his Royal Highnels the Prince of Piedmont and the Princels Polyxena of Heffe Rheinfels Rottembourg; being introduced by his Grace the Duke of Newcastle one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and conducted by Sir Clement Cottrell Mafter of the Ceremonies.

On the 11th the faid Marquels had Audience of their Royal Highnesses the Prince and Princels of Wales at Richmond, and delivered a Letter of like Notification from the King his Master; being conducted by Sir Clement Cottrell Mafter of the Ceremonies.

On the 13th the faid Marquels had Audience likewise of their Royal Highnesses the Princeffee at Kensington, on the same Occasion; being conducted by Sie Clement Cottrell Master of the Ceremonics.
