Falmouth, Novemb. 15.

Efferday in the Evening arrived here the Princefs Frigat, Sir William Jennings Commander, having together with the Turky fhips had a Fleet of about 30 fayl of Merchant men under his Convoy from the Streights, which are all fafely paffed up the Channel; this Morning he put to Sea again, with intention to ftop at Plymouth, and from thence to proceed for the Downes.

Portfmouth, Novemb. 19. Friday laft was launched the Anne Yacht, having been rebuilt here, and may in three or four days be ready to fayl, to be Commanded by Captain Gumman. Thursday laft arrived at Spithead the Bofton Merchant, Peter Lunt Commander, from Smirna, from whence fhe came in Company of feveral others, who are paffed by for the Downes, under the Convoy of Sir William Jennings in the Princefs; the faid Bofton Merchant is bound for Havre de Grace, where fhe is to unlade.

Downes, Novemb. 19. Yefterday arrived in the Downes the Meremayde, a fhip of about 300 Tun from the Barbados; they report that Island to be in a very good and thriving condition.

Lisbonng, Oftob. 17. The 7 inftant arrived a Fleet of ten layl of Merchant men from Rio de Faneiro in Brazile, feven of which came in hither, the other three proceeding for Port O Port; it is faid, that these finips are not forich as had been expected, some of them wanting of their full lading, which is most Wood, and nor having brought so great a quantity of Sugar as is usual:

The Friars of the Trinidade being returned from Afgiers, with 196 Slaves, which they had redeemed with the Moncys that had been here to that end collected, report, that there are yet remaining of this Nation in Slavery, near 400 more, for whofe redemption those Charitable Collections are still continued; the Duk- de Cadaval, the Marquis de Maria diva, and others of the chiefest quality in this Kingdom, going in period from dore to dore, to receive the Contributions of the Inhabitants powards fo pions a work.

Ratisbanne, Neventh. 5. This Dyet is affembled dayly, and labour with much earneftnefs for the concluding the filter of the Publick lecurity, having proposed, that whilft this affair continues in debate, orders fliould in the mean time be fent to the respective Circles, to bring their Forces together, to the end, they may be ready to march as there should be occasion : farther resolving, that fo foon as they should have finished, the Instructions for their Velt-Marshal, they would proceed to the Election of a General of the Empire, for which appear already feveral pretenders.

ded with a very rich Trayn, having above for coftly Liveries, and many perfons of quality ac, companying him, His ftay will not be long here he intending in few days to return with his Lady for Genoua.

Venice, Novemb. 6. At length by a Veffel arrived from Dalmatia we receive the good news of the conclusion of the matter of the Limits, with greater advantages to this State then had been expected; for by the Treaty now concluded between the Turkifh Baffa and Procurator Nani, we are; as we are, told, not onely refetled in feveral rights on the Frontiers, which formerly did belong to this Republick, but have firetcht out our Frontiers farther, then they werg, before, and have obtained other matters very confiderable to this State : by the fame Conveyance we receive advice of the continuance of the diffusbances in Arabia, and that the diforders and diffon 7 tents in those parts grow dayly greater, and begin tohave but a bad afpect.

We daily expect here General Bernardo, having had advice of his being on his way hither from Zunt, with four Galleys and two Galleasfles. Wednesday last arrived here Prince Frederick of Bringmick, he having, as is faid, thoughts of continuing this winter here.

Procurator Nani may fuddainly be here from Dajmatia, having acquainted the Senate, that fince his having fo happily determined those matters, he would with all convenient speed return hither to give them a more particular account of what had passed.

Genoua, Novemb. 11. The 9 inflant 'returned hither from Leghorne, Prince Doria, with his Bride the Princels Rossano, they having upon their arrival here, been received with the Complyments of all the perfons of quality about Town, and conducted through the City to the Prince's Palace, artended with a great Trayn of Coaches; the Prince Himfelf riding with 8 Bridemen on Horfeback, very rich in their Habits, and attended with a very numerous and fplendid Trayn.

Madrid, Novemb. 11. From Malaga they write ; of the 3 infrativ, that Captain Holmer continued cruifing in the Streights month 3 with hopes of intercepting fome of those Algerines, which we have, tadvice are abroad, on their return home. That they were certainly informed of two Brigantines of Tangier that had firanded, offe belonging to Tetuan; that they were in thaily expectation of the arrival of Sir John Chickely from England.

Marfeilles, Novembe 74. Here are at prelent in this Port, where they arrived through contrary winds, Captain Watfon in the Succels, Convoy to the Delight of Plymouth bound for Naples; and the Eagle, Captain Milberry Commander, and the Recovery of Falmouth bound for Legborne, from Newfoundland, from whence they came in 9 weeks, and tell us, that the other Convoy that is there with the remaining thips, might be ready to fayl in three weeks after their departure from thence? Yetherday dyed here Monfieur d'Oppede, first Prefa-" dent of the Parliament of Ais.

Cologne, Nov. 17. From Troves they write that

they had advice there of Sixteen Pieces of Canon that were come down the Moeles from Merz, and that they were arrived at Zurck, the last place of Lorrain, whither it was faid the Mareshal de Grequi was with his Forces to follow. That the Chapter at Trbues' was at present assembled for the chusing a Coadjutor, and that they had proposed the Dean of Spiers who is of the Electors Relation, but had not as yet determined any thing in it.

The Bishop of Munster is still at Kenternich, where have been lately several Conferences held between that Bishop, the Bishop of Strasburgh, and the Deputies of this place, though with as little success as formerly, they not having, notwith landing all their endeavors, been able to advance any thing toward an accommodation,

Our Elector continues to buy up very confiderable quantities of Corn, and other Grain, and hath late ly ordered, as we are told, 2000p Rixdollars for Bisket to be baked at Nuz, and other places hereabouts.

On Saturday last was mustered here the Marquels de Granz's Regiment, confisting of a thouland Mens at which time the feveral Companies received their Colours.

The Deputies of the Circle of Westphalia continue to press our Magistrates to give an answer to their late Proposals, in which they infift to have Colonel Bampfields Regiment removed out of this place, offering at the same time in their room, to suraiss to so Foot and 500 Horse: But our Magistrates continue, as is faid, resolved not to part with that Regiment upon any account.

Hague, November 20. The States of Holland and Weft-Friefland, are at prefere affembled, and as yet buffed about difposing of several vacant places, as well Civil as Military.

ces, as well Civil as Military. The Heer Van Haren hath taken his leave of the Sates General, in order to his fetting forward on his Embally to the Crownes of Smeden and Danemark.

The Lieutenant Admiral de Ruyter, is at prefent in Town, together with the Lieutenant Admiral Van Ghent, and leveral other Officers of the Fleet, to confult with the Deputies to that end appointed by the States General, concerning the next years Equipage.

We are told of fome intentions of Building a Fortnear Roveen, and of cleanfing the Lawer Rhyn and Ifels, to render the paffage of any Forces the more difficult. New flerday was publified an order of their States, requiring all Governors and other Military Officers in their Service, to repair to thein respective Commands, before the 23 infland, on forfeiture of their Employments.

Paris, Novemb. 25. We are told of an Express artived over-land from Suratte, from whence he came in March last, to give this East-India Com-pany an account of the present posture of their af-fairs in those parts, which they say go on very well i that Monfieur de la Haye was arrived there with to thips under his Command, being the Squadron, as we guess, which was some time fince reported to have been loft in the South Sea; and that there went thence a little before his departure two thips; the one called the Crown, of 500 Tun; the other the Golden Eagle, of 250 Tun; both very richly laden, and homeward bound, for the account of this Company. By the faid Express we have these for-ther particulars; that the Governor of surarrena defired to Treat with the Director that is there for pur East-India Company, for the advancement of Trade, and to that end had already taken off feveral of the Duties formerly imposed upon the French Commodivies brought thither, & that the Sieur de la Have was gone again from thence with 7 Men of war of his Squadron and tour Merchant men, to take possession of the Island Banca, being a very fine Illand about 25 Leagues in length and 55 in breadth. His Majefty hath nominated the Sleur Poncet de la Riviere Mafter of Requeft, to be Intendant of Alfatia, whither he is gone this week to execute his Majefties Orders there. It is faid, that the Weft-India Company have by Command from his Majer fly, fent to give notice to their respective Governors and Officers in those parts, that they be watchful in their feveral Stations, and that they take care their Garrifons and Fortifications be in a good poflure of defence against all accidents.
