By the faid Express we have these for-ther particulars; that the Governor of Suparishad desired to Treat with the Director that is there for our East-India Company, for the advancement of Trade, and to that end had already taken of feveral of the Duties formerly imposed upon the French Commodities brought thither, & that the Sieur de la Haye was gone again from thence with 7 Men of war of his Squadron and four Merchant men, to take possession of the Island Banca, being a very fine Island about 25 Leagues in length and 35 in breadth. deve in the Church of the Chartreux, by the Bithop of Viviers his Unkle, affilted by the Bistrops of Cominges and Mans, in the presence of the Archbishops of Paris and Tologe, and several other per-
