#### Madrid, June 19, N. S.

N the 15th Inftant the Court came to the Buen-Retiro from Aranjuez, and on the 17th, being Corpus Chrifti Day, his Ma-jeffy with all the Grandees affilted at the Proceffion in which the Holy Sacrament was carried: They accompanied it through most of the Streets of Madrid, the Fronts of the Houses on each of Madrid, the Fronts of the Houles on each Side being hung with Tapeftry and Pictures. The Queen with the Infances were at the Town-Houle, in a Balcony adorned for that Purpole, to fee the Proceflion pals The 16th, Don Jofeph Patino, Intendant of the Marine, fet out for Cadiz, in order to difpatch two Men of War, which are to be laden with Quickfilver for the Mines in the West-Indies, under the Command of Admiral Guevara. The 17th Inftant the Pope's Nuncio had an Audience of their Catholick Majefties, wherein he prefented to them Letters from the wherein he prefented to them Letters from the prefent Pope, and alfo his new Credentials; he defigns to go in a Day or two to St. Ildefonfo, in order to prefent to King Philip and his Queen other Letters from the Pope. Letters from Ca-diz relates that the Governour, upon the Quarrel that happened lately between the Irifh and Ma-rine Regiments, ordered Part of the latter to the Cattle of Margorda and 200 more of them to be The Regiments, ordered fait of the latter to the Caffle of Matagorda, and 300 more of them to be fent to Bifcay; the Irifh are to keep Garrifon in St Katherine's Caffle, and only Spanifh Soldiers are to do Duty in Cadiz: He alfo published an Order, that no Soldier should carry any Sort of Arms but when on Duty, upon Pain of Death. The fame Letters advise, that the two Men of Ware, named the Ruby and the Cocquidador of War, named the Ruby and the Conquistador of fixty and fifty Guns, are fitted out under the Command of the Marquels Mari; they are to Convoy the two Ships laden with Quicklilver as far as Cape St Vincent, and afterwards they are to come to Bifcay to joyn two Men of War new-ly buik, called the St. Lewis and St. Ferdinand, the first of eighty Guns and the latter of fixty, under the Command of Admiral Castanneta;

which four Ships are to Cruize, together with the Dutch Men of War, against the Algerines. Richmond, June 23. This Day the Count de Broglio Ambassadour in Ordinary from his most Christian Majesty, had his first private Audience of their Royal Highness the Prince and Princes of Wales, in their respective Apartments, to which he was introduced by Sir Clement Cottrell, Kt.
