Turin, June 28, N.S.

THE Mint here has been these three Months paft employed in Coining Imall Copper Money to be fent to Sardinia. The Gallies which carried over the late Reinforcement of Troops to that Island being returned to Villa Franca, are refitting, and are ordered to cruize against the Corfairs of Barbary which infeft the Coafts between Nice and Genoa. Some Days ago came on the Trial of the Noted Banker Colombo, who broke about four Years ago and retired into a Church, but being seized as he was walking out of the Limits of Holy Ground, was imprifoned : Upon Examination of his Books it appeared that he had made a fraudulent Bankruptcy, for which be was fentenced to be led in Proceffion with a Rope about his Neck through the Town and under the Gallows, and to work at the Oar in the Gallies for Life: Which Sentence being transmitted to the King at the Veneria, his Majefty was pleafed to mitigate the Rigour of his Punishment by changing it to Impriforment for ten Years. We have lately had very flormy Weather with Thunder and Hail, which has done much Damage in feveral Parts of this Country. This Evening the Court removes from the Veneria to Rivoli, and after two Days Stay there the

King and Prince intend to proceed on their Journey through Savoy to Thonon. Paris, July 5, N S. On the 30th paft, the King fet out from Versailles for Chantilly, whither the Duke of Bourbon went the Day before in order to receive his Majefty.

Hague, July 7, N. S. The King and Queen of Denmark fet out from Aix la Chapelle the 30th paft, on their Return to Copenhagen. General Fleming is also gone from Aix la Chapelle, to return to the Court of Poland. M. Buys having taken Leave of the States, is gone to Amfterdam, whence he will fet out in a few Days to follow his Danish Majefty to Copenhagen. Yesterday came Advice, that a Fleet of 23 Ships from the Eaft Indies, is arrived on our Coafts, and feveral are come into the Texel. The States of the Province of Holland are now affembled, and to Day they disposed of the Commissions for the Posts vacant in the Forces under their Repartition.
