Lisbon, June 18, N. S.

ON the 9th Instant failed from hence, for the Island of Corisco on the Coast of Guinea, the Primogenito a Ship of 36 Guns, Captain Francisco Eberard Commander, with three Sloops under her Convoy; in order to make a Settlement on the said Island for the Service of the African Company lately established here. There went out of this Harbour with them two other Portugueze Merchant Ships, the one for the Rio de Janeiro, the other for Maranhao; the last has on board Dom Francisco de Pilar, a Fryar of the Carmelite Order, who goes to found a new Bishoprick in the Province of Para. The British Man of War Dursley Galley, continues in this Harbour. An English Transport is lately arrived here from Portsmouth, in order to remove from hence the Naval and Victualling Stores, lodged here for the Service of His Britannick Majesty's Men of Mar, and carry the same to Gibraltar; where the Storekeeper and Agent Victualler now here, have received Orders to reside for the future.

Madrid, June 26, N. S. Letters from Cadiz of the 20th Instant advise, that the Dutch Squadron commanded by Rear-Admiral Godin, had brought in there a Prize called the Orange-Tree of Algiers, of 44 Guns and 300 Men, 40 of which are Christian Slaves and most part of them Spaniards: She was taken near the Streights-Mouth, after a hot Engagement, in which the Algerine had 30 Men killed and many wounded, but the Dutch lost only one Man.

Kensington, July 3. This Day the three Regiments of His Majesty's Foot-Guards passed in Review in Hyde-Park before His Majesty, who was accompanied by their Royal Highnesses the Prince and Princess of Wales, and attended by a great Number of the Nobility and other Persons of Quality: His Majesty was pleased to express his entire Satisfaction with the good Appearance the Regiments made.
