1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Westminster City Council proposes to make the above Orders under sections 6, 45, 46, 49 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.

2. The general effect of the Orders would be to introduce a "White Badge" disabled person's personal parking bay outside the entrance to Highwood House, No. 148 New Cavendish Street, to replace 5.5 metres of residents' parking.

3. The proposed Orders and other documents giving more detailed particulars of the Orders are available for inspection until six weeks have elapsed from the date on which either the Orders are made or the Council decides not to make the Orders between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive at WSP, Room 216, Portland House, Bressenden Place, London, SW1E 5RS.

**THE CITY OF WESTMINSTER (ESTATE PARKING) (OFF-STREET)
(NO. 1) (AMENDMENT NO. 3) ORDER 2019**

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Westminster City Council on 11th November 2019 made the above Order under sections 32, 35 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.

2. The general effect of the Order will be to facilitate the civil enforcement, under the provisions of the Traffic Management Act 2004, of parking in the service road at the rear of Alpha House, No. 1 Ashbridge Street and Earl House, No. 65 Lisson Grove enabling the Council's Civil Enforcement Officers to issue Penalty Charge Notices when parking contraventions occur.

3. A visitor / contractor parking bay, operating "at any time", will be formally designated on the estate at the rear of Alpha House. Vehicles must be parked within the limits of this parking bay and display either a residents' visitor permit or a contractors' permit.

4. The charge for a residents' visitor permit (in the form of a scratch card) will be £1.00 for 2 hours of parking (residents will be able to purchase up to 60 scratch cards each calendar year). There will be no charge for a contractors' permit. However, this latter type of permit will only be issued to Council staff or the Council's authorised contractors with official business on the estate.

5. Engine idling by waiting vehicles will be prohibited, with certain exceptions.

6. The Order, which will come into force on 18th November 2019, and other documents giving more detailed particulars of the Order are available for inspection until 23rd December 2019 between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive at WSP, Room 216, Portland House, Bressenden Place, London, SW1E 5RS.

7. Any person desiring to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any relevant regulations made thereunder have not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within six weeks from the date on which the Order was made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Bromley proposes to make the above-mentioned Orders under Sections 6, 45, 46, 49, 124 and 125 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended) and all other enabling powers, and those lengths of road that lie within the London Borough of Lewisham, pursuant to agreement under Section 19 of the Local Government Act 2000 with the councils of the said boroughs, in accordance with Regulation 7 of the Local Authorities (Arrangements for the Discharge of Functions) (England) Regulations 2012, and with the consent of Lewisham Council.

The effect of the Orders would be to:-

- introduce waiting restrictions as specified in the Schedule to this notice;
- introduce Pay by Phone parking places as specified in the Schedule to this notice;
- introduce time restricted free parking places as specified in the Schedule to this notice.

A copy of the proposed orders, of the plans of the schemes and of the Council's statement of reasons for proposing to make the Orders can be inspected during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays at the Bromley Civic Centre, Stockwell Close, Bromley, Kent.

ANY person wishing to object to the proposed Orders should send a statement in writing of their objection and the grounds thereof to the Director of Environment and Public Protection, Civic Centre, Stockwell Close, Bromley, BR1 3UH, quoting reference ADE(TP)/RP/T100/679 not later than 4th December 2019.

Persons objecting to the proposed orders should be aware that under the provisions of the Local Government (Access to Information) Act 1985, any comments received in response to this Notice may be open to public inspection.

WAITING RESTRICTIONS

No Waiting At Any Time:-

STATION APPROACH, Lower Sydenham, the south side, from the western kerbline of Worsley Bridge Road westwards to its extremity (except in marked bays).

WORSLEY BRIDGE ROAD, Beckenham, the south west side, from the southern kerbline of Station Approach, Lower Sydenham southwards for a distance of 18m.

PAY BY PHONE PARKING PLACES

Pay by Phone parking between 8am and 6.30pm on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive, except Public Holidays and Bank Holidays. 60p per hour – no maximum stay. Maximum charge - Monday to Friday £4, and Saturday £2:-

STATION APPROACH, Lower Sydenham, the south side, from a point 31m west of the western kerbline of Worsley Bridge Road westwards for a distance of 38m. (7 parking spaces)

TIME RESTRICTED FREE PARKING PLACES

Between 8am and 6.30pm on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive. 10 minutes maximum stay, with no return within 1 hour:-
