Lisbon, June 25, N. S.

ON the 19th Instant died here Sig. Joseph Zignoni, his Imperial Majesty's Resident at this Court. The Chevalier d'Eon arrived here a few Days ago from England, in his Way to Madrid.

Madrid, July 3, N. S. On the 25th past Don John de Caravajal y Alencastre appeared at Court, took on him the Title of Duke de Linares, and stood covered in the King's Presence as a Grande of Spain. On the 27th King Lewis and his Queen went to St. Ildefonso. Their Majesties came back from thence the 1st Instant. The Infante Don Carlos set out early this Morning for St. Ildefonso, where he is to stay two or three Months.

Turin, July 12, N. S. On the 1st Instant the King of Sardinia set out from Rivoli for Thonon in Savoy: On the 7th Mr. Molef worth the British Envoy set out from hence for Aix near Chambery, which is in the Neighbourhood of Thonon. Yesterday Morning the Cardinal de Bissi arrived here from Rome; and having dined at the Count de Vernon's, went to Rivoli to pay his Respects to the Queen, and then proceeded on his Journey to France. Last Week the Officers of Justice here had Intelligence of certain false Coiners living in a Village called Doujane near Mondivi; and upon Examination they have discovered that the Prior of a Convent of Carmelites in the same Village, together with another of the Monks, were the chief Accomplices; The former has made his Escape, but the latter is taken. It is said that the Marquess de Melaredé will be made first President of the Council at Chambery in Savoy, and that the Contador Fontana will succeed him in his Place of Secretary of State for Domestick Affairs.

Paris, July 17, N. S. The King continues at the Duke of Bourbon's Seat of Chantilly, taking almost daily the Diversion of Hunting the Stag or wild Boar. On the 12th Instant the Duke of Orleans set out for Chalons, there to receive the Princess of Baden his Spouse. The 13th they were married by the Bishop of Chalons at Saully his Country-Seat, whence they set out the 15th for Meaux.
