Turin, July 19, N. S.

AST Week a Chief Miner arrived here from Hanover, and brought with him 50 others, in order to work upon the Mines which have been discovered in the Mountains in this Neighbourhood : The faid Undertaker is to have a Salary of 4000 Livres The Weather has been extreamly a Year. bad here for this Formight paft, there having been violent Storms which have proved very deftructive to the Fruits and Corn in the Country: Last Saturday we had a Clap of Thunder, which split to Pieces a very large Oak Tree within 20 Yards of the great Magazine of Powder bere. Laft Week the Marchionels de St. Thomas and the Countels de St. Sebastian (being appointed the two first Ladice of Honour to the future Princefs of Piedmont) fet out from hence in order to meet ber Highnels at Schaffhuylen in Switzerland, and fo to attend her into Savoy, where the is expected about the 15th of next Month. The Court propoles to return hither Time enough to celebrate the Proceffion of the 8th of Septembers (in Commemoration of the Raifing the Siege of Turin,) at which 'ris believed their Majefties and the Prince will affift as usual; and Orders are given for the White-washing and Adorning about 400 Houses in the Screets where the Procession is to pale, intoider to make them conformable to the reft. The Day before Yesterday a Malefactor was brought into this Town, and was immediately conducted to the Senate, where after a short Trial he received Sentence of Death, and accordingly was hanged Yefterday Morning : Great Care was taken he should have no Communication with any body during his fhort Imprisonment in this Place; the Priefts

which were deputed by the Senate for that Purpole, never leaving him till after his Death ; fo that it is not publickly known who he was, nor the Crime he fuffered for.

Chantilly, July 24, N. S. The King con-tinues here in good Health. and is every Day Abroad a Hunting or taking öther Divertions. His Majefty fets out from hence in a few Days, to return to Verfaillet, where he will refide till the 28th of next Month, and then go to Fontainebleau. Yesterday the Duke of Orleans came hither, to pay his Duty to the King the first time fince his Marriage ; and after a few Hours Stay went back to his Dutchels at Bagnolet.

Hague, July 25, N. S. The Baron van Welderen, first Deputy of the Nobility of Gelder-land to the States General, died Vesterday. The States of the Province of Holland are to affemble here the 9th of next Month, to refume the Confideration of the Project for augmenting the Troops of this State, and for the Dispatch of other publick Affairs which have lain before them fome Time.
