Lisbon, July 23, N. S.

**L** E T T E R S from Goa advise, that two Pyrate Ships had been cast away at Cape del Gado, about 80 Leagues distant from Mozambique. This Morning sailed from hence for Madera a Portugueze Man of War with the Governour of that Island on board.

Madrid, July 24, N. S. Three Days ago the Marquês de Monteleon came back from St. Ildefonso, and is now preparing to set out in a few Days for Paris. Sig. Peregrini, a Florentine Abbot (who came from Leghorne about a Year ago with the Cardinal Belluga as his Auditor, but remained here when the Cardinal went last to Rome) has received an Order from the King of Spain to withdraw immediately out of all his Dominions.

Geneva, July 31, N. S. The King of Sardinia and the Prince of Piedmont are at Evian on the Side of the Lake of Geneva. His Sardinian Majesty, on his coming thither the 21st Instant, was complimented by two Deputies from the Magistrates of this City. On the 25th the Count du Bourgue, with the Marchionesses de St. Thomas and de St. Sebastian passed through this City with a Retinue of 60 Persons, on their Way to meet the Princess of Rhinfeltz, who is expected at Thonon a little Town near Evian the Middle of August. That Princess is to pass over the Lake from Morgues in the Pais de Vaud, in a Vessel which the Regents of Berne have caused to be built on purpose for that Service. Those Regents have issued Orders to the Officers of their Bailliages through which the said Princess is to pass, to shew her all due Honour. On the 29th Mr. Moleworth the British Envoy arrived here from Aix in Savoy.

Turin, Aug. 2, N. S. We hear from Savoy, that the King has named the Marquês de Riverole his Ambassadour, to go to Morgues to meet her Highness the Princess of Rhinfeltz, and to compliment her on the Part of his Majesty; and that the Chevalier de Bloni is appointed to go to Basil for the same Purpose on the Part of his Royal Highness the Prince of Piedmont. On the 28th of July, the Cardinal de Rohan arrived here from Rome, and was (according to his Majesty's Order) lodged and entertained at the Count de Vernon's: On the 30th he waited on the Queen at Rivoli, and afterwards continued his Journey towards France.

The Commissioners for managing His Majesty's Stamp Duties do hereby give Notice, That by a Clause in the Act of Parliament, for continuing the Duties on Malt, Mum, Cyder, &c. For Relief of all Masters and Mistresses who have omitted to pay His Majesty's Duties of SIX PENCE IN THE POUND for every Sum of Fifty Pounds or under, and of TWELVE PENCE IN THE POUND for every Sum amounting to more than Fifty Pounds Given, Paid, Contracted or Agreed for with Clerks and Apprentices, within the respective Times limited by the several Acts of Parliament in that Case made; Or who have omitted to insert and write in Words at length in the Indentures, or other Writings, containing the Covenants and Agreements relating to the Service of such Clerks or Apprentices the full Sum or Sums of Money received, or in any wise directly or indirectly Given, Paid, Agreed or Contracted for, All such Masters and Mistresses are Acquitted and Discharged of and from all Penalties incurred by such Omissions, upon Payment of the said Duties on or before the Twenty Ninth Day of September, 1724. And for preventing the like Omissions for the future, the said Commissioners do hereby further give Notice, That the Times limited by the Act of Parliament, which grants the said Duties for the Payment thereof, are ONE MONTH after the Dates of such Indentures or Contracts as are executed within the Limits of the Bills of Mortality, and TWO MONTHS after the Dates of such Indentures or Contracts as are executed elsewhere throughout the Kingdom of Great Britain; and that on Neglect of Payment within the respective Times before-mentioned, Every Master or Mistress so neglecting, incurs a Penalty of Fifty Pounds with Costs of Suit, and the Clerk or Apprentice, is made incapable of exercising the intended Trade or Employment, or of being made free of any City, Corporation, or Company. And the Indentures and Contracts are also void, and of no Effect. And in Case the full Sum or Sums of Money be not inserted, or written in Words at length in such Indentures or Contracts as aforesaid, the Master or Mistress thereby forfeits double the Sum which he or she really receives or agrees for. And all Persons neglecting or refusing to comply with the Terms of the said Acts of Parliament for the future, will be prosecuted for such Neglect or Refusal.
