Lisbon, July 23, N.S.

ETTERS from Goa advise, that two Pyrate Shipe had been calt away at Cape del Gado, about 80 Leagues di-ftant from Mozambique. This Morning failed from hence for Madera a Portugueze Man of War with the Governour of that Island on board.

Madrid, July 24, N. S. Three Days ago the Marquels de Montelcon came back from St. Ildefonio, and is now preparing to let out in a few Days for Paris. Sig. Peregrini, a Florentine Abbot (who came from Leghorne about a Year ago with the Cardinal Belluga as his Auditor, but remained here when the Cardinal went last to Rome) has received an Order from the King of Spain to withdraw immediately out of all his Dominions. Geneva, July 31, N. S. The King of Sar-

dinia and the Prince of Piedmont are at Evian on the Side of the Lake of Geneva, His Sardinian Majefty, on his coming thither the 21ft Infant, was complimented by two Deputies from the Magistrates of this City. On the 25th the Count du Bourgue, with the Marchioneffes de St. Thomas and de St. Sebastian passed through this City with a Retinue of 60 Perfons, on their Way to meet the Princess of Rhinfeltz, who is expected at Thonon a little Town near Evian the Midele of August. That Princess is to pass over the Lake from Morgues in the Pais de Vaud, in a Veffel which the Regents of Berne have cauled to be built on purpole for Those Regents have iffued Orthat Service. ders to the Officers of their Bailliages through which the faid Princels is to pafs, to shew her all due Honours. On the 29th Mr. Molefworth the British Envoy arrived here from Aix in Savoy.

Turin, Aug. 2, N. S. We hear from Savoy, that the King has named the Marquels de Riverole his Ambaffadout, to go to Morgues to meet her Highness the Princels of Rhinfeltz, and to compliment her on the Part of his Majefty ; and that the Chevalies de Bloni is appointed to go to Bail for the fame Purpole on the Part of his Royal Highnels the Prince of Piedmont. On the 28th of July, the Cardinal de Rohan arrived here from Rome, and was (according to his Majefty's Order) lodged and entertained at the Count de Vernon's : On the goth he waited on theQueen at Rivoli, and afterwards continued his Journey towards France,
