Madrid, August 7, N. S.

DOCTOR Perralta, a very eminent Physician here, who was put into the Inquisition between three and four Years ago, and kept there in close Confinement, was on the 1st Instant set at Liberty. On the 4th Instant the Infant Don Carlos arrived here from St. Ildesonso, where he had been for some Time; and the same Day came hither from thence the Marquess de Grimaldo, to be installed Knight of the Order of the Golden Fleece, together with four other Noblemen, whom King Philip had nominated upon his Resignation; which Ceremony was Yesterday performed at the Buen Retiro: The said Marquess will remain here some Days. This Morning early King Lewis set out for St. Ildesonso with a Small Retinue: His Majesty will return hither the 12th Instant. The young Queen of Spain appears every Evening at the Publick Walks called the Prado, near the Retiro. Letters from Algiers of the 20th of June advise, that the Day before two Algerine Cruizers arrived there, and brought into that Port a Prize called the Empress Elizabeth, belonging to the Ostend East India Company, homeward bound; her whole Cargo amounting to the Value of one Million of Pieces of Eight.

Lisbon, Aug. 6, N. S. By a Merchant-Ship that entered this Harbour on the 14th past, we had Advice, that his Britannick Majesty's Ship the Colchester had passed by St. Ubes to the Southward on the 12th. Nossa Senhora das Ondas, a Portugueze Man of War of 60 Guns, sailed the 23d of last Month for the Island of Madeira, having the Governour Dom Francisco da Costa on board. The Victoria, another Ship of the same Force, is fitting out with all Expedition, in order to carry Senr. Antonio de Miranda to his Government of Mazagam on the Coast of Barbary. His Britannick Majesty's Ship the Dursley Galley sailed from hence for Gibraltar on the 16th past. The Lime Galley, another British Man of War, is preparing to sail from hence for Port Mahon.

Turin, Aug. 9, N. S. The Court was to have been here against the Procession which is to be performed the 8th of next Month,

(in Commemoration of the raising of the Siege of this City) for which Occasion extraordinary Preparations were making, but Advice is come from Savoy that the King's Arrival here will not be till about the 15th of September, his Majesty intending to celebrate the forementioned Day at Chambery, as well in Compliance with the Request of the Savoyards, as on Account of the Prince of Piedmont, the Small Pox being at present very rife in this Place.

Scaffhuysen, Aug. 12, N. S. The Princess of Rhinteltz Rottembourg arrived Yesterday at Soluthurn, and To-Day is to proceed on her Journey to Thonon, where she is expected the 17th Instant.

Paris, Aug. 19. The 15th Instant being the Festival of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin, the King wearing the Great Collar of the Order of the Holy Ghost, heard Mass in the Chapel at Versailles, and received the Communion from the Hands of the Cardinal de Rohan, Great Almoner of France; who arrived at Court from Rome the 10th. The 15th M. Maffei, the Pope's Nuncio in Ordinary, had a private Audience of his Majesty, to which he was conducted by the Chevalier de Sainctot. The 16th his Majesty laid aside Mourning for the late Dutchess Dowager of Savoy.
