*Madrid, August 14, N. S.*

**K**ING Lewis returned from St. Ildefonso the 12th Instant, when the Queen his Consort went a League out of Town to meet his Majesty, and came back with him in his Coach to the Buen-Retiro. Yesterday Morning the Marquess de Grimaldo went back from hence to St. Ildefonso.

*Lisbon, Aug 19, N. S.* On the 6th Instant his Portuguese Majesty went incognito to St. Dominick's Church, and from a Throne erected for that Purpose, heard a Latin Oration pronounced by one of the Members of the Royal Academy, upon the Election of the New Pope. On the 8th two Dutch Men of War belonging to Rear-Admiral Godin's Squadron came into this Harbour to careen: They left their said Admiral with three other Ships under his Command cruising upon the Coast. The 13th his Britannick Majesty's Ship the Lyme, Lord Vere Commander, sailed from hence with Supplies for the Garrisons of Gibraltar and Port-Mahon.

*Stockholm, July 22.* Last Monday Morning the King went to Ekolfund to pass six or eight Days a Hunting in the Neighbourhood of that Palace; and 'tis said his Majesty designs to go from thence to Upsal to pass also some Days at that Place. The same Morning the two Princes of Saxe Gotha, accompanied by Vice-Admiral Taube and two or three Sea Captains, went down this River to view the Forts at Wexholm and the Dollars, and Yesterday they dined with the Great Marshal Count Tessin at a Seat he has that Way, from whence they returned last Night to Carlberg, where this Evening they are to be entertained by the Queen with a Ball, and To-Morrow they take Leave of her Majesty and set out to see the University of Upsal; from whence they return to take Leave of the King at Ekolfund, and so proceed on their Journey for Copenhagen. Pursuant to the Directions left by the States at their last Meeting, Field-Marshal Count Ducker, attended by several Officers, set out last Friday to muster all the Regiments in the several Provinces of this Kingdom.

*Stockholm, July 29.* The two Princes of Saxe Gotha, who went from hence last Friday, took Leave of the King of Sweden at Upsal, and Yesterday his Majesty was expected back from thence to dine at Ulrickshal, whi-

ther the Queen went to meet him. Count Poffe, late Envoy from this Court to that of Prussia, arrived here the Week before last.

*Copenhagen, Aug. 19.* M. Buys has had several Conferences with the Ministers of Denmark, in relation to the Payment of the Danish Troops which stayed with the Allies after the Separation. The two Princes of Saxe-Gotha are arrived here: They are travelling to see the Northern Courts, and are come last from Stockholm. The Court is now at Friedensbourg, where the King sees Company in Publick one Day in the Week.

*Berlin, Aug 19.* Major Guidot arrived here a few Days ago with 15 English Horses for the Use of his Prussian Majesty, and the said Major is to return to England in a short Time with some fine Coaches, which are a Present from the King of Prussia to his Royal Highness the Prince of Wales. The 15th Instant the King of Prussia went to Potsdam. Next Monday his Majesty goes to Ruppen, to review the Prince Royal's Regiment, and some others in that Neighbourhood, and about the End of this Month his Majesty designs to go to Westerhausen, to take the Diversion of the Season. The 16th Instant two Lieutenants of General Glasznab's Regiment, fought a Duel without the Gates of this City, one of whom was killed on the Spot, and the other has made his Escape.

*Windsor, August 18.*

This Day the Right Honourable the Lord Viscount Townshend one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, introduced to His Majesty Mr. Samuel Harris, and Mr. David Gregory, Masters of Arts, who had the Honour to kiss His Majesty's Hand, being nominated by His Majesty to be His Professors of Modern History, the first in the University of Cambridge, the other in that of Oxford.

*Windsor, August 19.*

Yesterday the King went out a Shooting and Courting in the Great Park and Forest of Windsor, being attended by divers of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction; and His Majesty intends to Course and Shoot there again To-Morrow.
