Vienna, August 9, N. S.

YESTERDAY their Imperial Majesties set out from the Favorita for Neustadt, and will return hither on the 26th Instant. Last Night the Duke of Aremberg, who 'tis said will be appointed Ambassadour from this Court to Paris, arrived here by the Way of Ratisbon. Count Windisgratz is also lately arrived here from his Estate in Bohemia, where he had been for some Weeks past in order to recover his Health by Change of Air.

Brussels, Sept. 4. The 28th past being the Empress's Birth-Day, there was a great Appearance of Persons of Quality at the Marquess de Prié's; but he having been indisposed for two or three Days before, the Marchioness de Prié received the usual Compliments on the Occasion, and in the Evening the Cannon on our Ramparts were fired. On the 1st Instant the Gates of this Town were kept shut till Nine a-Clock in the Morning, and in the mean time Field Marshal Count Vehlen went to the Lodgings of General Count Bonneval, and caused him to be taken into Custody, by Virtue of a Warrant from the Marquess de Prié. Yesterday in the Afternoon the said Count Bonneval was carried Prisoner to the Castle of Antwerp, in his own Coach with six Horses, guarded by 50 Dragoons commanded by a Captain: He was allowed to send an Express to the Court of Vienna, whither the Marquess de Prié dispatched another Express at the same Time.

Hague, Sept. 8. The States of Holland are summoned to meet here on the 13th Instant. Deputies from the Admiralty of Zealand are arrived here, with ample Instructions touching the Alteration, which has for some time been proposed to be made in the collecting of the Duties of Importation and Exportation; and Commissioners from the other Admiralties are daily expected, to confer together on that Subject with Deputies appointed by the States General.

On the 28th Instant the Reverend Dr. Ibbot was introduced to the King, when he presented to His Majesty a Sermon by him preached on the 1st of August before the Lord Mayor of London and Court of Aldermen.
