On the 1st Instant the Gates of this Town were kept shut till Nine a Clock in the Morning, and in the mean time Field Marshal Count Vehlen went to the Lodgings of General Count Bonneval, and caused him to be taken into Custody, by Virtue of a Warrant from the Marquels de Prié. Yesterday in the Afternoon the faid Count Bonneval was carried Prisoner to the Castle of Antwerp, in his own Coach with fix Horses, guarded by 50 Dragoons commanded by a Captain: He was allowed to fend an Express to the Court of Vienna, whither the Marquels de Prie dispatched another Express at the same Time.
