Rome, May 29. The Ministers of Spain have dispatcht a Courrier to D. Louis Ponce de Leon, to draw up the form for the Investiture of the Kingdom of Naples, being more then usually concerned at some expressions of the Pope; as if he would not receive the Annual T. ibme of a Horle at the Feast of St. Peter, which is yearly payable by the King of Spain to that See for the Investiture. The Spaniards being the more caucious, least by the omission, the French might in time, again revive their ancient pretentions, and occasion fresh

The great affair between the Pope, and the Dutchels of Mantua, who had much dif sarisfied his Holiness in banishing an Inquisitor out of her Dutchy, is at the last compesed by the interpolition of the Emperor, from whom the Cardinal Fonzhipresented the Duschels with Letters importing his defires, That her Highnels would give entire fatisfaction to the Court of Rome, severely blaming her proceeding, both in this business of the Inquisitor, and the other of the late contest with the Dischels of Modena. Danizick, June 12. We are advised by Letters of the 4 instant, that the King of Poland is every day making great Preparations for the carrying on of the Wai against the Conkeerates; ind is new forming a Leaguer at Blony, seven Leasurs for Warfam, having lately received an addition of 3000 fiest n cn, and expects every day 6000 out of Lythuania, who are upon their murch for his affiftance. Thole of great Poland old at their meeting frame a kind of Menifesto, by which they declare, that their taking up Armes, is so for from being invended against His Majesty, that they will affilt him with their Lives and Fortunes, but with this addition, whilst he maintaines their Laws and Priviledges. They have ordered all their leveral diffricts to be in Armes at the appointed places for their several Rendezvous the 21 inflant; and then they may resolve (as tis believed) to hold a Parliament in the open field (if his Majesty hinder it not) where Lubsmirski's T yal shall be examined 3 and according as they shall find it, to proceed either against kim or his Judges: where dis not doubted but he will be found innocent, his Examiners being all of his own faction; and 'tis

feared will execute the fentence on some of his Judges, which tiley had decreed against him.

It is reported by some lately come out of great Poland, that Lubemirski heth 2000 Dragoons, and as many Horfe fent to his affithance by the Emperor, who are joyned with 5000 Confederate Poles; and that he is at the head of then; on his march towards Lowitz, about ten Leagues diffant from the Kings Leaguer : if so, we may expect sudden

Seville, May 27. The Spaniards are much troublede that the nine Men of War fitting out at Cadiz, are not yet ready to joyn with the eleven already before Lishon, to hinder the putting in of Provisions into the Town.

The Dake de Veraguas is on his journey hither from Madrid, who is to command and take the charge of the Armada, the Admiral and several other Officers of the Fleet ex ecting his arrival.

Elsenour, fune 5. This week arrived 38 fail of Merchants, and a Galliot from Holland, and about 27 gone out from hence. The fhips fent to Stockholm upon the French account, are faid to be ready laden with their Naval Provideons, and are expected here with the first fair wind.

Another thip laden upon the same account at Lubeck, with Hemp and Platiks past the Sounds, the first Currant, and is failed for greater fecurity about Northwards; from which road there arrived several here lately from St. Malo's and Rochelle.

The Court is at present at Fredericksberg, where it has continue about twelve days. The people here begin to have a great distrust of the Hollanders affistance, especially since they make no greater hast with the ships designed for their al-

fistance, or the Guns so long promised them.

Venice, June 4. The last Letters from the Levant tell us, that the Sultan who is still at Adrianople, has sent more forces against the Cham of Tartary, who is very valiant in the field, his Army much in heart, encouraged by some successes they

have already had against the Turks.

'Tis likewise said, that ten Turkish vessels that escaped the Venetians out of the last a ounter, put on shore some Janisaries and other Soldiers, about 1000 men, between sittia and Girapieira, about 100 miles distant from Canea; and in their return towards Rhodes, were all of them taken by a Squadron of Christian Corlayres.

This Republick has declared Procuradore Valiero, fon to the late Duke, their Extraordinary Ambassador to complement the Empreis at Milan, and to attend her through the Venetian Territories as far as Trent; who intends to appear in great State, with at least 300 persons in his Train.

In pursuance of our ancient pretences of Soveraignty in the Adriatich Sea, some of our Vessels have lately seised on a Weffel laden with a great quantity of Corn, belonging to the Popes Chamber, which we hear is very much referred in the

Court of Rome.

Madrid, June 3. The Empress continues still at Gaudia near Denia; the Gallves not being yet ready to transport her, Don John of uffria though vigorously solliciting his entrance into the Councel according to his place, having had feveral Conferences, and private Audiences from the Queen, and discourses with the Ministers of State, about leveral weighty affairs, was in the end defired to withdraw himself again to Confregra, his former place of retirement, about thirty Leagues from Madrid.

This day came to Town Don Pascual de Arragon, Archbishop of Toledo, who as soon as he is settled, is to take his

place in the Junto of the Government.
