Madrid, August 28, N. S.

HIS Catholick Majesty is now in the Seventh Day of his Illness of the Small-Pox Count Robin arrived here the 20th Instant from Paris. The Marquess de Caylus, who was sent last Year to Galicia as Captain General of that Kingdom, is recalled hither. The Abbot de Livry, his most Christian Majesty's Ambassadour to the King of Portugal, proceeded from hence to Day on his Journey for Lisbon.

Chambery, Aug. 30, N. S. On the 18th the Princess of Piedmont arrived at Morges in the Pais de Vaux on the North Side of the Lake of Geneva, where was a Concourse of some Thousands of Gentry and Common People from all Parts of Switzerland to see her Highness. On the 19th she embark'd on Board a very handsome Brigantine provided by the Regency of Berne, with five others for her Retinue, and set Sail for Thonon; but the Wind proving contrary and boisterous, her Highness was forced to return to Morges after about an Hour's Navigation. On Sunday Morning the 20th, the Weather proving fair, her Highness's Brigantine put out again; and the Prince of Piedmont perceiving by the Firing of the Cannon the Time of her Departure, immediately set out with two Brigantines to meet her. As soon as the Brigantines joined, his Royal Highness went on Board the Princess's with three Gentlemen only, and conducted her safe to the Savoy Shore. The same Night the Marriage was confirmed by the Bishop of Ancey, and consummated. The Court remained at Thonon all Monday, and next Day came forward towards Ancey, where they arrived on Wednesday, and stayed Thursday and Friday: On Saturday they dined at the Castle of Greyly, within half a League of Aix, and at Night made their Entry into Chambery, which has been illuminated for three Nights successively. The Senate and Magistracy paid their Respects on Sunday, and all the Nobility of both Sexes the Day following. Her Royal Highness was Yesterday indisposed. His Sardinian Majesty does not intend to begin his Journey for Turin till the excessive Heats be over: They will last probably to the Middle of September, when the Autumn Rains usually fall. Every thing is excessive dear and scarce at Chambery, the Concourse of People being very great, and the Country not abounding in Provisions. The Court appear'd for three Days in great Splendour, but the Mourning is now resumed for Madam Royale, and will last till the first Week in March.

Turin, Aug. 30, N. S. The 27th Instant being the Queen's Birth-Day, most of the Nobility went to Rivoli to pay their Compliments to her Majesty: The Cannon of the Citadel were discharged, and a Battalion of each of the Regiments of Fusiliers and Montferrat were upon that Occasion under Arms on the Place Royale, and fired three Volleys. The Court is not expected

here till the 20th of next Month. The Summer has been hotter here than has been known these many Years; the Heats still continue very violent, so that the Country suffers extremely for want of Rain.
