OUNT Schonborn the Vice-Chancellour of the Empire fers out this Day for Wurtzbourg : His Election to that Bifhoprick is looked upon here as certain. Count Wurmbrant Vice-Prefident of the Aulick Council, is appointed to go to Wurtzbourg, as Commifiary from the Emperour. 'Tis faid Cardinal Cienfurgos will be made Prefident of the Council of Italy, and that the Count de Monte Santo, who has at prefent that Employment, will be appointed Viceroy of Sicily. We have had here for thefe three Weeks paft, as violent hot Weather as has happened in the Memory of Man 3 and the Letters from Italy bring Accounts, that the Heats have been fo exceflive there, that divers Perfons have run diffracted and made away with themfelves.

Lisbon, Sept. 3. N. S. His Britannick Majcfly's Ship the Dover, Captain Cayley Commander, failed hence the 24th path for England; as did the two Dutch Men of War belonging to Rear Admiral Godin's Squadson the 30th following, in order to cruife three Weeks or a Month upon the Coaft, and then proceed to Cadiz: What haftened the Departure of the latter, was an Algerine Cruifer's having taken a Fifher-Boat at the Mouth of the River a few Days before. A Portugueze Man of War, that returned the other Day from Madera with the late Governour of that Ifland on Board, is alfo ordered immediately to put to Sea to protect the Coaft.

Madrid, Sept. 4, N.S. On the 28th paft in the Evening, King Lewis was again attacked with a violent Fever, for which he was let

blood; but the Fever continuing the next Day, and the Small Pox returning into his Body, the Phylicians despaired of his Life : Whereupon the several Orders of Fryzrs in Madrid carried all their Reliques, and the most noted Images of their respective Saints, into his Majefry's Bed Chamber, and made folemn Prayers for him; but his Majefty died the 31ft past between Two and Three a Clock in the Morning. His Corpfe was laid upon a Bed of State (which was fet up for that Purpose in one of the great Halls at the Buen-Retiro) the 1ft Inftant at Night, and the two Days following feveral Ceremonies of Devotion were performed in the faid Hall, at which affisted the Great Officers of the Court and many of the Laft Night about Nine a-Clock, Nobility. his Majefty's Corple was carried upon a Sort of Litter to be interred at the Elcurial, where is the Burial Place of the Kings of Spain: It was preceded by 100 of the Horfe Guards,-then came 12 Fryars of each Religious Order in Madrid with Wax Torches in their Hands, after them came a Prieft with a Crofs furrounded by feveral Grandees and others, and immediately after them the Litter (upon which the Corple was laid) carried by two Mules cover-ed with White, most of the Grandees and others of the Nobility accompanying it, and 200 Horfe Guards cloled the Procession. On the 1ft Inftant in the Evening, King Philip and bis Queen came from St. Ildefonfo to the Palace here in Madrid, that by his Prefence he might prevent any Diforder. The fame Day his Catholick Majesty died, the Marshal de Teffé went to St. Ildefonso to have an Audience of King Philip; the Marshal returned hither the Day following. The Queen (King Lewis's Widow) remains full at the Buen-Ret:ro. The 25th of laft Mouth an Express from Cadiz

Cadiz brought Advice of the Atrival there of the Flota from New Spain, commanded by Don Antonio Serrano, cooffiling of two Men of War and 12 Merchant Ships; which failed from Vera Cruz the 21ft of May laft, put into the Havana the 6th of June, proceeded from thence the 28th of that Month, and on the 20th pail came into the Bay of Cadiz, having

Tentainebleau, Sept. 15, N. S. The 5th of this Month Don Patricio Lawles, the Spanifh Ambaffadour, had a private Audience of the King, and introduced to him the Marquels de Monteleon Ambaffidour Plenipotentiary from bis Catholick Majefty to the Princes of Italy: To which Audience he was conducted by the Chevalier de Sainctot. The 8th, the King had an Account by an extraordinary Courier dispatched from Madrid the 30th past at Night, that the King of Spain was past Hopes of Recovery. By a second Courier who left Ma-drid the 5th Instant at Night, his Majesty received Advice of that Prince's Death the Night between the 30th and 31ft paft. King Philip came to Madrid the 1st lastant; but it was not known the 5th at Night, whether his Majefty would comply with the earnest Request of the Council of Caffile to refume the Government.

Whitehall, Sept. 11. Whereas a Letter figned A. B.
