WHereas Our Parliament stands prorogued to Thursday the Twenty fourth Day of this Instant September, We, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby Publish and Declare. That the faid Parliament shall, on the faid That the faia Fasilament heal, on the faia Twenty fourth Day of this Instant September, be further prorogued to Thursday the Twelsth Day of November next ensuing the Date hereof, to be then held at Westminster; and We have given Orders to Our Chancellour of Great Britain given Orders to Our Chancellour of Great Britain to prepare a Commiffion for proroguing the fame accordingly. And We do hereby further Declare Our Pleafure, That the faid Parliament shall, on the faud Twelfth Day of November next, be held, and fit for the Dispatch of divers weighty and important Affairs : And the Lords Spiri-tual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesfes, and Commissioners of Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their Atten-dance accordingly at Weltminster, on the faid dance accordingly at Westminster, on the faid Twelfth Day of November next.

Pox : And as his Majefty is very appre-henfive of that Diftemper, he has forbid any Perfon who only entered the Palace at the Buen Retiro during the Illnefs of the late King, to appear at their Majefties Court till after 40 Days. Before his Catholick Majefty went to St. Ildefonso, he was pleased to appoint the Marquels de Grimaldo his first Secretary of State, for the Dispatch of Affairs in the fame Manner as before his Majefty's Renunciation, the Cabinet Gouncil being at prefent fulpended : The faid Marquels accompanied his Majefty thither, and is fince fallen ill of a Fever and Ague. The Marshal de Teffé went likewife the' 12th Inftant to St. Ildefonto with the Confent of his Catholick Majefty, the faid Matshal being the only Foreign Minister who did not go near the Retiro while his tate Catholick Majefty was ill of the Small Pox, for fear of the faid Diftemper, which he has never had. The Marquese de Scoti will set out To-Morrow for Ballaio, where he will remain during their Majesties Stay at St. Ildefonfo. The Small Pox are come out very violently on the Queen Widow; yet the Phyficians have great Hopes of her Majefty's Recovery.
