THE Emperor has agreed to restore Commachio to the Pope; who has lately issued an Order for abolishing all Pensions granted upon any Benefices having Cure of Souls, and for preventing all such Practices for the future. The 1st Instant being the Anniversary of the Emperour's Birth-Day, it was observed with the usual Ceremony. In the Morning there was a great Appearance at Court of the Nobility and foreign Ministers, and at Night a Consort of Musick. The Prince Emanuel of Portugal came Post from Lintz that Day, to make his Compliments to the Emperour; and the same Day went back to his Regiment. Count Watford, Envoy from the King of Poland to the Great Duke of Tuscany, proceeds from hence To-morrow for Florence.

Madrid, Oct. 9, N. S. On the 4th Instant a Courier was dispatched from St. Ildefonso to Paris, with the Order of the Golden Fleece to be presented on the Part of his Catholick Majesty to the Count de Morville Secretary of State for foreign Affairs to the most Christian King. Their Catholick Majesties, and the Infantes, are in good Health at St. Ildefonso; where it is thought they will continue till the End of this Month: Mr. Stanhope the British Ambassadour, and most of the other foreign Ministers, are gone thither for some Days.

Whereas eighteen Felons Convict were lately shipped off on Board a Sloop in the River Humber, in order to be transported to His Majesty's Dominions in America, but have since made their Escape from on Board the said Sloop on the Shore of Essex; and there is all possible Cause of Suspicion that the said Escape has happened through the Connivance of some Person or Persons intrusted with the Care of their Transportation. In order to the discovering and punishing of the Authors and Abettors of this wicked Practise, that the like may the better be prevented for the future, and that the Offenders may be secured and brought to Justice; His Majesty is graciously pleased to promise His Pardon to any one or two of the said Felons, who will surrender him, or themselves, and make Discovery thereof, in such manner that the said Offender or Offenders may be brought to Justice and punished according to his or their Demerits.

And for preventing as much as possible any Abuses in the said Payments, it will be expected, that where the Seamen cannot attend themselves, their Letters of Attorney shall be witnessed by two or more Commission or Warrant Officers of His Majesty's Ships in which they serve, or by two or more of the Officers of His Majesty's Navy or Visualling, or by the Mayor, or by two or more of the Magistrates of some Corporation, or by a Publick Notary, or by the Minister and Church-Wardens of the Parish, (where the other cannot be had,) and where old Letters of Attorney are produced, they are to be accompanied with the like Attestation that the Persons who made the same are living.
