Nformation having been given that Brigadier Mackintofh was come into the Highlands of Scotland, and had been there for fome time, one of His Majefty's Meffengers was fent down thither with a Warrant to apprebend him ; accordingly the 6th Inftant the Meffenger taking fome Perfons to his Affiftance, feized the Brigadier with one of his Brothers ; bat several People coming in and overpower-ing these who had taken him, the Brigadier made his Efcape ; but his Brother, being very much wounded, was fecured, and remains a Prisoner : And as His Majefty bas formerly iffued the Proclamation here-under inferted for feizing and apprehending the faid Brigadier Mackintofh; Thefe are to certify all whom it may concern, that whoever shall now fecure and bring him to Juffice, shall receive the Reward of One Thouland Pounds, as specified in the faid Proclamation.

A PROCLAMATION,

For Apprehending William Mackintofh, commonly called Brigadier Mackintofh, Charles Wogan, James Talbot, Robert Hepburne, William Delmayhoy, Alexander Delmayhoy, John Tasker, and John Mackintofh.

W Hereas William Mackintofb, commonly called Brigadier Mackintofb, who is a tall rawboned Man, about Sixty Years of Age, fair Complexioned. Beetle-Browed, Grey Eyed, freaks broad Scotch, Charles Wogan. James Talbot, Robert Hepburne, William Delmayhoy, Alexander Delmayhoy, John Tasker, and John Mackintofb, who were lately committed to the Goal of Newgate for High Treafon, in levying War againft Us within this Realm, did, on Friday the Fourth Inftant, make their Efcape ont of the faid Goal 3

We have therefore thought fit, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to iffue this Our Royal Proclamation, hereby requiring and commanding all Our loving Subjetts what foever to use their utmost Endeavour to discover and apprehend the said William Mackintosh, Charles Wogan, James Talbot, Robers Hepburne, William Delmayhoy, Alexander Delmayhoy, John Tasker, and John Mackintofb, and to carry them before one of Our Justices of the Peace, who is hereby re-quired to commit them to the next Goal for the faid High Treason, there to remain till they shall be discharged by due Course of Law 3 of which such Justice of the Peace is hereby required to give immediate Notice to one of Our Principal Secretaria of Sector and the peace For Principal Secretaries of State. And for the Encouragement of all Perfons to be Diligent and Care-ful in endeavouring to Difcover and Apprehend the faid Perfons. We do hereby further declare, That whoever shall Apprehend and bring before fuch Justice of the Peace, the said respective Persons, or any of them, shall have and receive for such of them, fo to be Apprehended and brought before a Justice of Peace, the Rewards following, That is to fay for the faid William Mackintosh, the Sume of One Thousand Pound; and for each of them the faid Charles Wogan, James Talbot, Robert Hepburne, William Delmayhoy, Alexander Delmayhoy, John Tasker, and John Mackintolo, the Sum of Five Hundred Pound : Which Rewards the Lords Commiffioners of our Treasfury are hereby Re-quired and Directed to Pay accordingly.

Stockholm, Sept. 23, O. S.
