THE Foreign Ministers, who went to St. Ildelfonso to pay their Compliments of Condolence to his Catholick Majesty upon the Death of the late King Lewis of Spain, & likewise their Compliments upon his present Majesty's Re-accession to the Crown, are returned hither from thence. Their Catholick Majesties with the Infantes will be here on the 28th Instant, in order to be present at the Sitting of the Cortes, which are to be held the Beginning of the next Month for Executing the Acts necessary to recognize the Infante Don Ferdinand Prince of Asturias. His Catholick Majesty has been pleased to continue Don Juan Baptista Orendayn Secretary of State, and he is to serve his Majesty in that Employment in Case of the Illness or Absence of the Marquess de Grimaldo. The Marquess de Ledesma is made President of the Council of War in the Room of the Marquess de Aytona, who has obtained Leave of his Majesty to resign the said Employment, and to retire into the Country. The King of Spain has granted the proper Cedula for the Admission of the South-Sea Company's Annual Ship (which is to sail this Year) into the Spanish West Indies. Letters from Cadiz advise, that a Spanish Ship is lately arrived at that Port from the Honduras, having on Board One Million Two Hundred Thousand Pieces of Eight.

Hague, Oct. 31. M. Amerong who was to have gone with the Deputation to the Provinces of Friseland and Groeningen, being fallen ill, the other Deputies set out from hence the 28th Instant. The States of Holland separated the 27th, and are to meet again the 14th of next Month; when they will resume their Deliberations on the Project for augmenting the Troops of this State; and 'tis thought that in taking their final Resolution upon it, they will be principally determined by the Report which the forementioned Deputies shall make to them.
