*Turin, October 21, N. S.*

A Few Days ago the Prince of Schwartzbourg-Rouelstadt arrived here from Germany, being accompanied by several Persons of Quality of that Country; he waited on his Sardinian Majesty at the Veneria, and was entertained with great Magnificence. M. Sorba, the Genoese Resident at this Court, has had his first Audience of the King, but without Ceremony. M. le Plat, the Dutch Minister, has also been admitted to congratulate his Sardinian Majesty upon the Marriage of the Prince of Piedmont; the same having been notified to the States General by M. Oforio, his Sardinian Majesty's Minister at the Hague.

*Ratisbon, Oct. 19.* Count Wratisslaw who was Minister to the Dyet here from Bohemia, set out this Morning for Poland, being to reside at the Court of King Augustus in the Quality of Ambassador from the Emperour. The Director of Mentz is charged with the Vote of the Electorate of Bohemia *per interim*, and it is said that Count Schlick will succeed Count Wratisslaw in that Employment, and that he is actually preparing his Equipage to come hither. The Elector of Cologne was expected last Night at Munich. A Conclusion or Sentence of the Aulick Council has been given against Baron Ingelheim, upon the Complaints of the Nobility of Franconia, for his violent Proceedings against his Protestant Subjects; by which he is condemned to a Fine of 60 Gold Marks, to refund what he has taken from them, and make them an Equivalent for

what has been destroyed and dissipated, and to submit to the Jurisdiction of the Nobility for the Decision of the main Cause; in case of Obstinacy, the Council of War at Vienna have given Leave to the Nobility to draw what Number of Troops they shall think proper from the Garrison of Erfurt, the Commander of that Place having also received Orders to furnish them.
