To the King's Most Excellent Majesty,

The humble Address of the University of Oxford.

May it please your Majesty,

E your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal
Subjects, the Chancellour, Masters and
Scholars of your University of Oxford, beg Leave to offer in your Royal Presence the Tribute of our unfeigned Thanks for the Execution of your Majesty's most gracious Intentions lately fignified to us of Founding a Professorship in each of your Majesty's Universities for Modern History, in humble Confidence this Address of Gratitude for your Royal Bounty now bestowed upon us will meet with the same savourable Acceptance, as did our Answer of Thanks to your Majesty's most gracious Letter, which brought us the first Assurances of it.
