ON the 16th Instant Mr. Finch had his Audience of Leave of the King and Queen of Sweden; and the same Day Mr. Poyntz had his first Audience of both their Majesties. On the 23d Instant Mr. Finch set out from hence to go by the Way of Copenhagen and Hambourg to Holland. Some Days ago Field-Marshal Count Ducker arrived here, and has made Report to the King and Senate of the Condition of all the Regiments he had been reviewing in the several Provinces, which Regiments he found compleat and in good Order.

Hague, Nov. 21, N. S. The States of the Province of Holland are now assembled. The Squadron for the Mediterranean is settled, viz. three Men of War of 52 Guns and 300 Men each, and three of 44 Guns and 250 Men each, with three Tenders: The Pay of this Squadron to commence from the 1st of December next, and to continue to the last of October following: The Commander in Chief is not yet named. The Squadron already in the Mediterranean is ordered to return home. The Deputation sent to the Provinces of Friseland and Groeninghen, is not yet returned. The Count de Bonneval, who had an Express from Vienna last Week, set out Yesterday from hence. The College of the Nobles of this Province of Holland being reduced to four, did on the 13th Instant nominate three more to augment their Number, viz. M. Vander Duyn Brother to the Countess Dowager of Albenarle, M. Wassenar Burgomaster of Leyden Brother to the late M. Duyvenwoorden, and Baron Languerac a Relation of M. Boetselaer; which M. Boetselaer is declared President of the Committeerde Raeden in the Room of M. de Noortwyck, and M. Boetselaer resigns his Place in the Admiralty of the Maese to M. Twickel.
