**T**HE 31st of last Month the Prince of Asturias and the Infantes arrived here from the Escorial: The same Day their Catholick Majesties went to perform their Devotions in the Church of our Lady of Atocha, and in their Return to the Palace made a Visit to the Queen Widow who was then at the Hermitage of St. Paul. The Infante Don Ferdinand, now Prince of Asturias, has quitted the Priorship of Castille, of the Order of Malta, in favour of his youngest Brother the Infante Don Philip, by reason of the Statutes of that Order, which forbid Entrance into the State of Matrimony. On the 10th Instant the Marquess de Miraval, late President of the Council of Castille, had an Audience of his Catholick Majesty, in which he thanked his Majesty for the Honour of Counsellour of State with an Annual Pension of 10000 Crowns granted him upon his resigning the said Presidency. On the 11th Instant his Catholick Majesty review'd the Marquess de Risbourg's Company of the Walloon Foot-Guards, which made a very handsome Appearance, being composed of the tallest Men in the Regiment, with which his Majesty was well pleased. They write from Cadiz, that the Dutch Squadron, which was cruising in the Mediterranean against the Algerines, had put into that Port; but that in a few Days it will set Sail for Holland, taking under its Convoy all the Dutch Merchant Ships that are there homeward bound. Letters from Lisbon mention, that the Ab-

bot de Livry, the French Ambassadour at that Court, has not as yet had an Audience of his Portuguese Majesty, the Ceremonial not being settled. His Excellency Mr Stanhope, the British Ambassadour, having received the King of Spain's Cedula or the South-Sea Company's annual Ship, will forthwith transmit the same to London.

*Turin, Nov. 22, N. S.* On the 11th Instant was performed the great Hunting, which had been put off from St. Hubert's Day because of the bad Weather: The King was attended by the Prince of Piedmont and all the Court, as also by Mr. Moleworth the British Envoy, in their proper Habits; and afterwards the Company was magnificently entertained. The Return of his Sardinian Majesty and the Court from the Venetia to Turin, is fixed for the 1st of December. Three Days ago part of the French Ambassadour's Baggage arrived here. On Sunday last the Count de Constanza, Nephew to the Marquess de Prié, Governour of Flanders, was married to Mademoiselle de St. Maurice, formerly Maid of Honour to Madame Royale, the Wedding was celebrated with great Splendour.

*Hague, Nov. 28, N. S.* The Deputies who were sent to Friseland and Groeninghen, returned hither the 22d Instant, and on the 23d and 24th made their Report to their High Mightinesses. M. de Wassenauer, one of the said Deputies, who was lately made one of the Nobles of Holland, being gone Home to Leyden, of which he was Burgomaster, fell ill there, and died on the 26th Instant.
