N the 9th Instant the Marquess de Capecelatro, his Catholick Majesty's Ambassadour Extraordinary at this Court, had Audience of the King of Portugal, when he notified the Death of the late King Lewis, and at the same time prefented his Letters of Credence from King Philip: The Court is gone into Mourning upon this Occasion for a Month The 10th being the Birth-Day of his Royal Highness the Prince of Wale, Mr. Sanderson his Britannick Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary at this Court, entertained the Foreign Ministers, Nobility, and other Persons of Distinction at Dinvocal and Instrumental Musick, at which was a great Appearance of Ladies, who were afterwards conducted to a fine Collation, which was followed with a Ball that held till Morning. The whole Entertainment passed with a Magni-ficence suitable to the Occasion. The same Day ficence suitable to the Occasion. (the roth) His Britannick Majesty's Ship the South-Sea-Castle, Cap ain Delgarnoe Commander, put into this Port in her way from England, ha-ving on board Admiral Perez the Emperour of Morocco's late Ambassadour at the Court of Great Britain. She failed the next Morning for Gibraltar, and from thence proceeds to Tetuan with that Minister. On the 19th in the Evening arose a very violent Storm of Wind and Rain, which has done very great Damage in this City and the Country about it. A great Number of Houses were blown down, others unroofed, and several Thousands of Olive-Trees torn up by the Roots. The Shipping has likewise suffered extremely, a great many driven ashore and staved in Pieces. Two Dutch Men of War belonging to Admiral Godin's Squadron, that are bound Home, were obliged to put into this Port the next Morning, having received great Damage, and very narrowly escaped being cast away upon the Coast.
