Lisbon, November 25, N. S.

ON the 9th Instant the Marquess de Capelatro, his Catholick Majesty's Ambassadour Extraordinary at this Court, had Audience of the King of Portugal, when he notified the Death of the late King Lewis, and at the same time presented his Letters of Credence from King Philip: The Court is gone into Mourning upon this Occasion for a Month The 10th being the Birth-Day of his Royal Highness the Prince of Wale, Mr. Sanderfon his Britannick Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary at this Court, entertained the Foreign Ministers, Nobility, and other Persons of Distinction at Dinner. In the Evening there was a Consort of Vocal and Instrumental Musick, at which was a great Appearance of Ladies, who were afterwards conducted to a fine Collation, which was followed with a Ball that held till Morning. The whole Entertainment passed with a Magnificence suitable to the Occasion. The same Day (the 10th) His Britannick Majesty's Ship the South-Sea-Castle, Cap'n Delgarnoe Commander, put into this Port in her way from England, having on board Admiral Perez the Emperour of Morocco's late Ambassadour at the Court of Great Britain. She sailed the next Morning for Gibraltar, and from thence proceeds to Tetuan with that Minister. On the 19th in the Evening arose a very violent Storm of Wind and Rain, which has done very great Damage in this City and the Country about it. A great Number of Houses were blown down, others unroofed, and several Thousands of Olive-Trees torn up by the Roots. The Shipping has likewise suffered extremely, a great many driven ashore and staved in Pieces. Two Dutch Men of War belonging to Admiral Godin's Squadron, that are bound Home, were obliged to put into this Port the next Morning, having received great Damage, and very narrowly escaped being cast away upon the Coast. This Day arrived here His Britannick Majesty's Ship the Ludlow-Castle, Captain St. Lo Commander.
