ON the 16th Instant the Duke de Bannos, a Grandee of Spain of the first Class, and Brother to the Duke d'Arcos, received Advice by an Express from Lisbon, that the Title of Duke d'Aveyro, and the whole Estate of that Dutchy in the Kingdom of Portugal, had been adjudged in his favour after a Law-Suit of many Years, which Inheritance belongs to him by Right of his Mother, and is reckon'd to be worth above 30000 Doblons a Year; likewise that the Revenues for several Years past, which have been deposited during the Time of the Law-Suit, are to be restored to him. Yesterday Sig. Bragadini, a noble Venetian, who has been here as Ambassadour from the Republick of Venice for three Years past, set out from hence in order to return home: His Catholick Majesty presented him some Days ago with his Picture set round with Diamonds to the Value of 800 Pistoles. Letters from Cadiz of the 14th Instant give an Account, that the Day following the Oneto and Brandon, two Spanish Men of War commanded by the Count de Clavijo, were to sail out of that Port, in order to go to the West-Indies to cruize against the Pyrates on those Coasts.
