N the 16th Inftant the Duke de Bannos, a Grandee of Spain of the first Clais, and Brother to the Duke d'Arcos, received Advice by an Express from Lisbon, that the Title of Duke d'Aveyro, and the whole Effate of that Dutchy in the Kingdom of Portugal, had been adjudged in his favour after a Law Suit of many Years, which In-heritance belongs to him by Right of his Mother, and is reckon'd to be worth above 30000 Dobloons a Year; likewife that the Revenues for feveral Years paft, which have been deposited during the Time of the Law-Suit, are to be reftored to him. Yesterday Sig. Bragadini, a noble Venetian, who has been here as Ambassadour from the Republick of Venice for three Years past, fet out from bence in order to return bome: His Catholick Majefty prefented him fome Days ago with his Picture fet round with Dia-monds to the Value of 800 Piftoles. Letters from Cadiz of the 14th Inftant give an Ac-count, that the Day following the Oneto and Brandon, two Spanish Men of War commanded by the Count de Clavijo, were to fail out of that Port, in order to go to the West-Indies to cruize against the Pyrates on thole Coafts.
