Harbours Act 1964 (As amended) The Proposed Holyhead Harbour Revision Order Notice of Further Environmental Information

1. On 6 January 2020 Stena Line Ports Limited ("Stena") applied to the Welsh Government for a Harbour Revision Order under section 14 of the Harbours Act 1964 ("the 1964 Act").

2. The proposed Order would authorise Stena to construct and maintain works at Holyhead harbour in the County of Anglesey. The works comprise the reclamation of two areas of land within the harbour together with associated works including a wave wall, an area of rock armour revetment and two single storey warehouse buildings. The Order would also authorise the construction of subsidiary works and confers powers to dredge for the purposes of constructing and maintaining the works.

3. The application is subject to an environmental impact assessment and the Welsh Government has received further information in relation to the environmental statement which was provided with the application and the Welsh Government is of the view that the further information requires to be considered in order properly to assess the likely environmental effects of the proposed project.
