Information having been given to his Catholick Majesty, that Don Rodrigo Cavallero, Intendant of the Kingdom of Galicia, had committed several Misdemeanors, his Catholick Majesty has given Orders for the Confinement of the said Don Rodrigo Cavallero in the Castle of Segovia, until further Proof of the said Information. The Marques de Caylus, Captain General of the Kingdom of Galicia, set out from hence the 16th Instant for that Province. The Marques de Campo Florido still continues dangerously ill, and as his Catholick Majesty has not as yet nominated any Person to act as Superintendant of the publick Revenues during the Illness of the said Marques, there was on the 16th Instant a Meeting of the Ministers (by Order of his Catholick Majesty) for regulating the Payment of the Arrears due to the Army. M. Vander Meer, Ambassadour from the States General to this Court, is to make his publick Entry on the 3d of next Month. Letters from Cadiz of the 12th Instant advise, that a Consul from Muscovy is arrived there, and is admitted to the Exercise of his Employment.

Turin, Dec. 30, N. S. The Snow lying sufficiently thick in the Streets of Turin, the Prince of Piedmont appeared two Days ago with a Train of Sleds, in which were several Court Ladies, conducted by as many Gentlemen of his Royal Highness's Retinue, and others of the best Quality. Her Majesty and the Princess were placed in a Window of the Castle formerly inhabited by Madame Royale to see this Show, which was very splendid; the Sleds after many Turns on the Place-Chateau, preceded by Kettle Drums and Trumpets, drove to the King's Palace, where a magnificent Collation was prepared for the Company in the

Prince's Apartment. It is said, his Sardinian Majesty designs an Encampment of 12000 Men next Spring on the Plains of Livorno about 20 Miles from hence towards Milan. The Members of the Council of War appointed to try Count de Sales, are the Baron de St. Remy Lieutenant General President, the Marquesses d'Entraves and Forchieri Major Generals, the Marquesses de Castagnolles and St. Alban Brigadiers, Messieurs de la Perouse and Pastoris Colonels: The Senator de Cariatoure sets as Auditor of War, M. de la Perouse who was Envoy in England having declined that Office: Sg. Bersterini, a Florentine, officiates as Judge-Advocate. This Commission has sat once, and has sent a Summons to Count de Sales who is at Cremona. The Marquess d'Aix is named to succeed the Marquess de Breuil at Vienna; and it is thought this last will be sent to the Court of France with the Character of Ambassadour. The Contador Fontana is to go to Rome to endeavour an Accommodation with that Court, of Affairs which have been long depending.
