#### PRESENT,

The King's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

His Majesty having constituted the Right Ho-nourable Sir Joseph Jekyll, Kt. Master of the Rolls, Jefferay Gilbert, Esq; one of the Barons of His Majesty's Court of Exchequer, and Sir Robert Raymond, Kt. one of the Justices of His Majesty's Court of King's-Bench, Lords Commissioners for the Custody of the Great Seal, was this Day pleased in Council to deliver to them the Great Seal of Great Britain; and the faid Lords Commissioners did thereupon take the Oaths of Allegiance and Supremacy, and also the Oath as Lords Commissioners for the Custo-dy of the Great Seal And His Majesty conferred the Honour of Knighthood on Jefferay Gil-Eíq;

After which His Majesty was pleased to express himself to the said Lords Commissioners in

the Words following, viz.
"I have had fuch Experience of your Integri-"ty and Ability, that it is with Pleafure I now
"put the Great Seal into your Hands. You
"are fully informed of the State of the Ac"compts of the Masters in Chancery; I earnest-" ly recommend to you the taking effectual "Gare that entire Satisfaction be made to the Suitors of the Court, and that they be not exposed to any Dangers for the future; and
I have such Considence in your faithful Discharge of the Trust I now repose in you,
that I am perswaded you will look narrowly
into the Behaviour of all the Officers under wour Jurisdiction, and will see that they act with the strictest Regard to Justice, and to the Ease of my Subjects.

Vienna, Dec. 30, N.S. Letters from Constantino-ple of the 25th of last Month relate, that the Turkish Army commanded by the Governour of Van, having advanced to Tauris, made an Affault in hopes of carrying it without the Formalities of a Siege, but there was so numerous a Garrison in the Place, and the Persians defended themselves so obstinately, that they repulsed the Turks with great Loss, and have made them defer their De-

fign of besieging it till next Spring. The Pasha of Bagdat had fent an Account to the Port, that fince the taking of the Province of Hemedan, he had made himself Master of another adjoyning to it called Lorestan, wherein are two confiderable Cities called Nechevend and Usud-get. The Pasha of Bagdat had also sent Advice, that it was reported there that a splendid Embally was coming from Mirveiz to the Grand

Madrid, Dec. 25, N. S. On Sunday last the Fatthers of the Order of Mercy for the Redemption of Captives, made a publick Procession here with those whom they largly brought from Algiers, and passed by the Palace where their Catholick Majeities and the Royal Family stood to see them. Cardinal Alberoni is to relign the Bishoprick of Malaga, to which his Catholick Majesty intends to promote Father Garcia late General of the Fryars of the Order of St. Francis. Their Catholick Majesties have declared, that on the 7th of the next Month they will go to the Pardo, where they will divert them-felves with hunting for some short time: The Marquess de Grimaldo is to attend their Majesties thither, and all Affairs are to be directed to him by the other Ministers and Secretaries of State during their Majesties Stay there.
