His Majesty in Council was this Day pleased

Madrid, Jan. 1, N. S. The Count de Altimira, a Grandee of Spain of the first Class, and Lord Chamberlain of his Catholick Majesty's Household (who was a particular Favourite of the late King Lewis) was taken ill on the 22d past, and some Days after a Gangrene appeared in one of his Legs, so that on the 27th it was necessary to cut it off. He has since had an intermitting Fever, but the Physicians having given him the Jesuits Bark, are yet in Hopes of his Recovery. On the 26th past Sig. Canale, Ambassadour from the Republick of Venice, made his first Visit to the Marquess de Grimaldo, and has since solicited Audiencies of their Catholick Majesties; he has also notified his Arrival to the foreign Ministers residing at this Court, who thereupon have paid him their Visits. On the 30th a Courier from Paris passed through this Place with Dispatches to the Abbot de Livry his most Christian Majesty's Ambassadour at Lisbon, to whom it is said he carries Orders to in-

sist that his Portuguese Majesty's Secretary of State shall pay to him (the said Ambassadour) the first Visit, and in case of his not doing so, to come away immediately from Lisbon.

Turin, Jan. 6, N. S. On Monday last, being New-Year's-Day, the Senate and Magistracy of Turin went to Court in their Formalities, and had the Honour of complimenting their Sardinian Majesties, and the Prince and Princess of Piedmont on that Occasion, and were admitted to kiss their Hands; as were also the Nobility of both Sexes. The same Day and the following, Mr. Moleworth, the British Envoy, had publick Audiencies of the King and Queen of Sardinia, the Prince and Princess, the Duke d'Aoste, and the Princesses of Carignan. The Princess Louisa and Prince Eugene de Soissons excused themselves from receiving any publick Compliments, the first being in a Convent, and the last at the Academy: However the Envoy made them private Visits the same Evening. The Prince of Piedmont has kept his Chamber two or three Days, by reason of an Inflammation in his Foot; but his Royal Highness appeared To-Day at the King's Levee.

Hague, Jan. 16, N. S. The Resident of Denmark here has been authorized by his Court to continue the Negotiation with M. Buys, or any other the States shall please to name, for composing the Differences which still subsist between that Court and this Republick. On the 10th Instant died M. Ham Burgomaster

Burgomaster of the Town of Amboina, who for many Years had been Deputy from the Province of Gelderland to the States General. The States of the Province of Holland will re-assemble here To-Morrow.
