The King's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

His Majefty in Council was this Day pleafed to appoint the following Sheriffs, viz.

Madrid, Jan. 1, N. S. The Count de Altamira, a Grandee of Spain of the firft Clafs, and Lord Chamberlain of his Catholick Majefty's Houfhold (who was a particular Favourite of the late King Lewis) was taken ill on the 22d paft, and fome Days after a Gangrene appeared in one of his Legs, fo that on the 27th it was neceffary to cut it off. He has fince had an intermitting Fever, but the Phyficians having given him the Jefuits Bark, are yet in Hopes of his Recovery. On the 26th paft Sig. Canale, Ambaffadour from the Republick of Venice, made his firft Vifit to the Marquefs de Grimaldo, and has fince follicited Audiences of their Catholick Majefties; he has alfo notified his Arrival to the foreign Minifters refiding at this Courts who thereupon have paid him their Vifits. On the 30th a Courier from Paris paffed through this Place with Difpatches to the Abbot de Livry his moft Chriftian Majefty's Ambaffadour at Lisbon, to whom it is faid he carries Orders to infift that his Portuguele Majefly's Secretary of State fhall pay to him (the faid Arobaffadour) the first Visit, and in case of his not doing so, to come away immediately from Lisbon.

Turin, Jun. 6, N. S. On Monday laft, be-ing New-Year's-Day, the Senate and Magiftracy of Turin went to Court in their Formalities, and had the Honour of complimenting their Sardinian Majeftics, and the Prince and Princele of Piedmont on that Occasion, and were admitted to kils their Hands; as were alfo the Nobility of both Sexes. fame Day and the following, Mr. Molefworth, the British Envoy, had publick Au-diences of the King and Queen of Sardi-nia, the Prince and Princes, the Duke d'Aoste, and the Princess of Carignan. The Princels Louila and Prince Eugene de Soiffons exculed themlelves from receiving any pub-lick Compliments, the fift being in a Convent, and the last at the Academy : How-ever the Envoy made them private Visita the fame Evening. The Prince of Piedmont has kept his Chamber two or three Days, by reason of an Inflammation in his Foot 3 but his Royal Highnels appeared To-Day at the King's Levce.

Hague, Jan. 16, N. S. The Refident of Denmark here has been authorized by his Court to continue the Negociation with M.
